

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

Hurricane Helene, a category 4 hurricane nearly 400 miles in length, touched down in Florida on Sept 26th, 2024. The giant storm caused many Florida residents to evacuate their homes and leave behind devastating damage. Helene started in the Big Bend area and then made its way north where severe flooding and winds significantly hit the Southern Appalachians. The horrific storm affected six different states on its journey: Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, Virginia and Tennessee. According to scientists at the University of South Carolina, this hurricane was the most powerful one to hit the Big Bend area north of Tampa since 1851. Helene was strong enough to pick up and wash away homes, taking hundreds of innocent human and animal lives who could not evacuate in time.

Hurricane Milton, the second hurricane to hit Florida, was not as powerful as Helene, but left even more damage and destruction. Milton touched down in Siesta Key, Florida on October 9th as a category 3 hurricane after being downgraded twice from its initial magnitude of a category 5. Milton was Florida's third hurricane in 2024 and there were even more evacuations and homes destroyed.

How do Hurricanes form?

A hurricane is considered the most violent and vicious type of storm. One forms when multiple storms suck up heated air from the ocean and move it into the Earth's atmosphere. It is classified as a hurricane when the speed of the wind inside of a storm reaches 74 mph or more. Inside of the storm, there are organized thunderstorms and a strategic system of clouds that are born over tropical waters. There are four stages of a hurricane, according to scijinks.gov.

1. Tropical Disturbance This stage is when water vapor from the ocean forms clouds while it releases heat into the air. The air then rises and forms cloud columns. The wind circulates around a center as the cloud pattern continues to develop.

3. Tropical storm

When the wind speeds hits 39 mph, the depression becomes a storm. This is also the stage where the storm gets a name. The winds begin their twisting formation around the eye, the center of the storm where it is calm.

2. Tropical Depression As the thunderstorm ages, the air at the top of the cloud formation cools and becomes unstable. The heat energy is released from the cooling water vapor and the air at the top of the clouds heats up even more, causing winds to push outwards. The air surface moves to the lower pressure area, rises, and creates more thunderstorms, causing the clouds to spin significantly faster. When the winds reach anywhere between 25-38 mph, scientists consider this a tropical depression.

4. Hurricane

The storm is considered a hurricane when the wind speed officially reaches 74 mph and is at least 125 miles across. The eye must be 5-30 miles wide. The winds and the low air pressure create a surge of water from the ocean, which stacks higher and higher near the eye of the hurricane, which causes horrific events when it hits land. At that point, hurricanes commonly become weaker on land because they lose their energy source: the ocean. When they move further inland and away from the ocean, the giant storms dumps water and causes catastrophic wind damage.

Middle school can be the gateway to passions and accomplishments. 8th grade year was that stepping stone for Madelyn, better known as Maddy, Wallace. Before that year, cross country was merely a sport she knew hardly anything about, let alone one she would think to take part in. Wallace states, "I have been running since 8th grade, and I only did cross country because my parents made me. However, I really came to love it." Right off the bat, Wallace possessed the 8th grade girls 1.5 mile race record. Little did she know, this would spark a domino effect in records throughout high school.

Most female distance runners experience a massive cut in their times from middle school to high school. Maddy experienced this as well. From the beginning of her freshman season, Wallace was a fierce competitor in the high school field. Wallace finished in 6th place at the 5A cross country state meet. Her 2023 5A track season included a 1600m 9th place finish, 3200m 8th place finish, and a 5th place finish in the girl's 4x800m relay at state. While these accomplishments describe the overflowing talent she possesses, they don't share about her personal characteristics.

In addition to the running community, Wallace's community in her faith has brought a vast amount of support. When asked about what brought her to Jesus Christ, Maddy explained, "My friends really brought me to my current church and really helped me grow in my faith." Her beliefs have brought a deeper value into her sports. "I have more confidence when competing for a higher purpose," Wallace explains. In addition to value and confidence, her faith ushered a few extra steps in her pre-race ritual. "I always draw 2 things on my arm before I race. I write "all in" and add a cross next to it. Our team also always prays before races which brings calmness to my mind." Peoples' motives to compete drive from a variety of things. Wallace derives hers from faith.

Community is the foundation of sports and holds people together into what we all know as a "team." With the cross country team and track team being that foundation for



Wallace, they support her through the highest and lowest moments of her life and running career. Her team holds a huge place in her heart, and she has a lot of gratitude for them. Wallace proclaims, "It [running] has given me a community like no other. I am grateful to be a part of it. I know some people tend to dis, or hate, on cross country and distance runners, regarding track, because who wants to run for that long? However, it is the feeling after that makes it worth it. I'm always proud of myself but rarely satisfied. But, however, those feelings combined, and alone, are what get me out of bed at 5 in the morning for practice."

Wallace's community has provided her with relationships which are surrounded with the same passions. "I have a lot of people that I am grateful for supporting me. Especially my teammates as a whole. They have gotten me through many tough times and practices. It is always nice to have a group of amazing people who have the same passions as me that I am able to talk to everyday at practice. Furthermore, my amazing coaches are always there for me, not just on the track, but with my life outside of the sport, which means a lot to me."

All athletes struggle with something within their sport. For Wallace, it is the satisfaction after a race. "I have some issues with being satisfied after races, but I think it just motivates me more to be better. After I accomplish a goal, I already have my next goal in mind, and it stays in my mind while I'm training or even racing." Many athletes, especially runners, may experience this issue as well. Wallace voices the advice, "smile, cry, laugh, or whatever you need to do after you accomplish a goal. Give yourself that."







The common quote "buckle up to save lives" teaches people the importance of wearing a seatbelt no matter which seat you are sitting in. The National Day Calendar states, "Just over 90 percent of Americans buckle up, saving an estimated 15,000 lives each year." Schools worldwide help raise awareness about wearing seatbelts. Officer Kintzel has helped spread awareness throughout Andover High by doing "seatbelt checks" with the help of the Student Council. Each semester Student Council members stand at the parking lot entrances keeping track of how many parents and students are wearing their seatbelts, but he also promotes safe driving in many different ways throughout the school.

Interview with Officer Kintzel

Q: What is the activity you do at lunch?

A: "Students will have 4 chances to sign a pledge card to always wear their seat belt and not text and drive. As long as they don't receive a seat belt citation or warning their name stays in the drawing. In April, all of the pledge cards go into a grand prize drawing. 2 cards will be drawn and 2 students will receive \$150 Visa cards as a Grand Prize. All this money, given away, just to encourage students to wear a Seat Belt. Sign your pledge cards, and get your chance to win \$\$ for wearing a Seat Belt; it's painless, and should be a chance to win money for something you are already in the habit of doing."




Q: What is SAFE?

A: "SAFE stands for Seatbelts Are For Everyone. The program is to raise awareness to the undebatable fact; wearing a seat belt dramatically decreases chance of death in an auto accident, and reduces injuries as well. The caveat; some people disregard the message, because people do die in car crashes wearing a seat belt. This isn't a failure of the seat belt, but the fact, with 75 MPH speed limits, some crashes just have forces the body cannot withstand. Be sober minded and drive with caution. The good news, because of the protective power of seat belts and airbags, people are surviving crashes now that previously would not have been unsurvivable. Always wear your seat belt, it could save your life."

History of Seatbelts

In 1885 Edward J. Claghorn created the first seatbelt. Cars only knew two-point lap belts until 1959, when a safety engineer, Nils Bohlin with Volvo, introduced three-point seat belts with a shoulder strap, lap strap, and buckle. A few yearslater in 1968, the federal government required seat belts in new cars in the United States.



Early Action vs Early Decision

There are many different types of admissions. Some colleges have different requirements or deadlines surrounding the types, but this is the general information. Early Decision is generally binding. You can only apply ED to one school, and if you get in, you have to go to that school. There can be up to two ED admissions. Early Action is not binding and allows you to apply earlier (normally November 1st) before the regular deadline (normally January 1st). This allows you to get your admissions results earlier, and there can be up to two EA admissions.
