students are ready for entry-level
college coursework in the areas of
reading, writing, and mathematics..

Skyline Early College students will have several opportunities to review and practice for these important exams during Advisory periods and TSIA Boot Camps every Friday starting on November 4th.

Skyline ECHS Goals

- 9th graders: will be tested by Dec.
 16th for ELAR (English Reading/Writing) only
- 10th graders:will be tested at least once by Dec. 16th for ELAR and MATH
- 11th graders: 90% TESTED and minimum 50% passed TSI or met through waiver exemptions.
- 12th graders: 100% tested with minimum of 85% passed TSI or met through waiver or exemption

TSIA EXAMINATIONS NOVEMBER - DECEMBER

Parents:

Be aware of the importance of passing college entrance exams!

All students can pass with preparation. Please encourage your student to study and practice until the day of the exams.

Good to Know!

Early College students in the 9th grade can take EDUC-1300, BCIS-1405, and PHED-1164 without passing the reading and writing component of TSIA.

Once students are in the 10th grade, the only course available if students have not passed TSIA ELAR is ARTS-1301 or MUSI-1411. students are required to have passed TSIA to continue taking college courses. SPCH-1311 and SOCI-1301 in the 10th grade are only available to those students who have passed reading and writing ELAR TSIA.

Do not let your student not be able to take those courses. Pre-test and practice should be prioritized until exam day!

MATHEMATICS


Algebra I Honors - Dr. Neal

MATH-1332 college course Contemporary Mathematics (Quantitative Reasoning)

This is a Texas Common Course Number. This is a Dallas College Core Curriculum course.

Prerequisite Required: TSIA Math College level ready in Mathematics at the non-algebra or algebra levels.

Course Description: Intended for Non STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) majors. Topics include introductory treatments of sets and logic, financial mathematics, probability and statistics with appropriate applications. Number sense, proportional reasoning, estimation, technology, and communication should be embedded throughout the course. Additional topics may be covered. (3 Lec.)

This is a Texas Common Course Number. This is a Dallas College Core Curriculum course.

Prerequisite Required: TSIA ELAR College level ready in Reading and Writing.

Course Description: Intensive study of and practice in writing processes, from invention and researching to drafting, revising, and editing, both individually and collaboratively. Emphasis on effective rhetorical choices, including audience, purpose, arrangement, and style. Focus on writing the academic essay as a vehicle for learning, communicating, and critical analysis. (3 Lec.)

ENGL-1301 Composition II

Course Description: Intensive study of and practice in the strategies and techniques for developing research-based expository and persuasive texts. Emphasis on effective and ethical rhetorical inquiry, including primary and secondary research methods; critical reading of verbal, visual, and multimedia texts; systematic evaluation, synthesis, and documentation of information sources; and critical thinking about evidence and conclusions. (3 Lec.)

Chemistry - Dr. Tirrey

Our scholars are working with the periodic table this week. The periodic table is important because it is organized to provide a great deal of information about elements and how they relate to one another in one easy-to-use reference. Biology for Science Majors I This is a Texas Common Course Number. This is a Dallas College Core Curriculum course. Prerequisite Required: TSIA ELAR College level ready in Reading.

Course Description: Fundamental principles of living organisms will be studied, including physical and chemical properties of life, organization, function, evolutionary adaptation, and classification. Study and examination of the concepts of cytology, reproduction, genetics, and scientific reasoning are included. Laboratory activities will reinforce these concepts. (3 Lec., 3 Lab.)
