

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

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

Community Member, Raymond Villar: How do you do the hiring – are their committees when you do hiring? Superintendent, Charles Tracy: Yes, there are committees formed during hiring. Superintendent, Charles Tracy: we are contracted with California School Boards Association (CSBA) for our board policies. CSBA is the nonprofit education association representing the elected officials who govern public school districts and county offices of education. CSBA brings together school governing boards and administrators from districts and county offices of education to advocate for effective policies that advance the education and well-being of California's school-age children.
