A student or staff member either -answers "yes" to a health screening question -OR- Exhibits the following COVID-19 symptoms: Students: Fever of 100.4 degrees or higher; Sore throat; New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing; Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain; New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever.	 Student/staff are isolated at the site until they can be sent home or to a healthcare facility per CDPH guidance If student/staff tests positive, see Scenario 3. If student/staff tests negative, see Scenario 4. In addition, the individual may have a medical note by a physician that clears student to return to school.
