Spring 2022 CAASPP Test Results-Hamilton leads Glenn, Colusa, and Tehama Counties

California recently released the Spring 2022 CAASPP test results. Statewide, there were declines in student test scores in English, Math, and Science. Most of the decline has been attributed to how particular schools were affected by the Covid pandemic closures as many students statewide were on virtual learning for extended periods of time. You may recall that Hamilton High returned in person in late Fall 2020, though in partial days, and in full in Fall 2021. Additionally, our state proactive in connecting and communicating with our students closure set-up was much more and families. For the released test scores in "met" or "exceeded" categories, Hamilton High School scored the highest among Glenn County high schools in English, Math, and Science! By comparison, our scores also topped the main high schools in Colusa and Tehama counties. Hamilton High scored 53.30% in English; 22.73% in Math; and 30.56% in Science. While our scores in English and Math were at or near state averages, we did decline in both, while we increased in Science and our Science was higher than the state average. We will use this data and other information to continue to improve our students achievement and efforts in the state testing. While we are proud to continue to be at the forefront of student achievement in our local area, we also will be dedicated to growing our strengths and identifying areas of need. Thank you to our students and staff for their ongoing good work!

ATTENTION SENIORS:

Counseling Department would like to remind all Senior about the application deadlines for CSU, UC, Local Scholarships and FAFSA. Don't wait until the last minute to submit your applications. Below are the links to the websites for college applications. If you have any questions please see your counselors. They are available to assist with the general components of the applications, but they cannot complete or fill it out for the applying student.

<u>California State University Application</u>: Filing period for all CSU campuses is from October 1 to **November 20, 2022**. The preferred method of application is online at Cal State Apply: https://www2.calstate.edu/apply

<u>University of California Application:</u> Filing period for all UC campuses is from November 1 to **November 30, 2022**. Students can start their application online at <u>www.universityofcalifornia.edu</u>

<u>Common Application:</u> Many out-of-state and private colleges use the Common Application. This application is available online at www.commonapp.org

<u>Local Scholarships:</u> all local scholarships, along with statewide and national scholarships, are located on the HHS webpage counseling tab as well as in the counselors' office.

<u>FAFSA</u>: This is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Students submit the FAFSA to apply for financial aid for college from the federal government, state governments, and most colleges and universities. Financial aid includes grants, scholarships, student employment, and student loans. The FAFSA opens October 1, 2022. For students to be considered for Cal Grants, they must complete and submit their FAFSA by **March 2, 2023**.

Butte College Promise Grant (2 years FREE): This grant offers students the opportunity of up to two years free from enrollment fees for new, first-time Butte College students. The Promise Grant does require that the student complete and submit their FAFSA (or CADAA for Dream Act students) to be eligible. The Promise Grant is not based on income.

Campus tours 2022!!!



Pursuing Victory with Honor

Hamilton High is a proud member of the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF). We are in the Northern Section of CIF and have been active participants at various levels of the CIF leadership throughout the decades of our membership. Over the past 20 years, CIF has instituted programs aimed at instilling Pursuing Victory With Honor in each member school. Hamilton High adopted the principles associated with Pursuing Victory With Honor in 2001, and at the last HUSD board meeting, re-affirmed the belief in these principles for our student-athletes, staff, and families. To build character and ethics in sports and life, It is important to embody the concepts of sportsmanship through the following six core principles of character: Trustworthiness; Respect; Responsibility; Fairness; Caring; and Good Citizenship.

We believe strongly in these tenets and that these are also traits that our staff, our parents/guardians, and fans of the Hamilton Braves must adhere to. Sports are a wonderful avenue for student participation and growth, especially in building character. Recently, CIF adopted new bylaws aimed at ensuring that spectators meet consequences for unruly, confrontational, and negative behavior. Each school will have these bylaws as a manner to help prevent incidences of violence toward game officials (referees, umpires, admin, school staff, players, coaches). The bylaw calls for law enforcement to be involved, for potential prosecution, and for, in effect, banning spectators who cross the line from attending school events due to their behavior. We want all our activities and events to be filled with positive passion and great cheering for all student-athletes and spectators. We are committed to that goal at Hamilton High School and thank you for your cooperation and good sportsmanship! Go Braves!

If you would like to help and be part of Boosters, come join us at our meetings on the first Monday of each month @6pm.




