Campus News:

- 7th and 8th graders participated in Tobacco Prevention Talks facilitated by GCOE this past month
- We had a successful Back to School Night on August 31st. Unfortunately, we cancelled our large gathering due to the increased numbers of COVID positives, but it was well attended and informational for our parents.
- Mr. Langan and Mrs. Reyes visited our 8th grade Career Prep classes this last month to begin preparing our students for what's to come at HHS.
- Our Volleyball and Flag Football teams have been actively practicing and competing thanks to the support of our two coaches, Coach Nall and Coach Larson, as well as supported by our parent drivers
- The Boys and Girls Teen Center is up and running. They are now serving over 30 middle school students after school.

Instructional News:

- First UDL (Universal Design for Learning) training (supported by our Glenn County Partners) with UDL (Universal Design for Learning) took place on Friday, 9/17.
- Derek Nall has launched the CAST program, providing socio-emotional, behavioral, and academic support to identified students.
- Our music rotations now include our lower primary grades on Fridays, thanks to Ms. Knutson, who is providing SEL support through music. This enables our lower primary teachers to provide more intensive/targeted instruction to small groups of students who need a little extra support.

Coming Up:

- The first parent workshop led by Mrs. Camarena is scheduled for 9/28 with a focus on supporting our new Kindergarten parents with how to navigate our school platforms in order to strengthen the bridge between home and school.
- Our first APTT meeting will be on 9/29 and led by 4th grade teacher, Ms. Godinez.
- Movie Night fundraiser will be September 30th at 5:30 pm.

1. HHS/EBHS Enrollment for 2021-22: HHS: 9th=63; 10th=81; 11th= 70; 12th= 75. Total= 289 + 9 (EBHS)=298. This is an increase of 4 from June projections at HHS.

We continue to draw approximately 35-40% of students from out of district!

For 22-23, enrollment is projected to increase at HHS/EBHS to approximately 300-305.

2. HHS First 30 Days: The 2021-22 HHS School Year has gone as smooth as could be expected and has shown the continued resilience, adaptability, and grace of the HHS Teachers/Staff! We are pleased to announce that English Teacher Ms. Mary Hansen and her husband, Brian, welcomed a healthy baby boy (Ari Old) on August 30! All are healthy. Ag Teacher Mr. Andrew Martin and Jessekah Martin welcomed a healthy baby girl (Wren Martin) on September 16. Hamilton High Congratulates each and wishes continued health and well-being to all!

Our Teachers have assisted/subbed in many different capacities and will continue to do so for the upcoming weeks as we have Teacher on leave. Since late August, I have been coordinating sub needs for multiple staff for various reasons and have been in a number of classrooms myself. We are fortunate to be one of the few schools that has had outside subs come to our school site.

An additional nuance and reality caused by the Covid effect is the number of student/staff quarantines due to close contact or results. Teachers have shown so much understanding and grace as weekly there are numerous instances of students on our quarantine list. We work very closely with our school nurse and have great reliance on the specifics of quarantine requirements (i.e. dates, vax status).

While some requirements have been revised, and may continue to be, generally speaking it is 10 days of quarantine with a positive test or a determined close contact. If a staff or student close contact is vaccinated, there is no quarantine. There are some nuances depending on if masks were worn, if the person has previously had Covid, etc., but generally speaking, those are the basic starting set dates/info.

I would like to thank Kylee Paulos, School Nurse; Erin Johnson; and Cristina Rios who, along with myself, have handled the majority of contact tracing, determinations, and phone calling to our families. I have taken it upon myself to individually notify my staff members of exposure when a student/staff has tested for Covid. In some cases, this may mean several conversations a week, but it is the reality of our times.

3. Teachers/Staff inservice: High school focus areas remain:

- a. Continue to love, embrace, & nurture students academically, socially, emotionally
- b. Continue to love & support our staff and their needs
- c. Continue building relationships with the greater HC Community
- d. Form growth of all HHS programs through increased communication, collaboration, & pr.

As reported months ago, this is an accreditation year, with a virtual visit set to occur in mid-November. We have already begun the process of self-study at our staff meeting/pd times.

4. **Activities Report:** I was very proud of my HHS students assisting at several events as community service, including the HC Lions Club Chicken BBQ on Saturday September 18 at the HC Community Park! The students exhibited respect, leadership, and initiative throughout the event and I was so very excited for their service! They have also assisted at Back to School Night, at HES, after school athletic events, and at our Parent/Teacher conferences.

Thank you to all who assisted and participated in the Hamilton High Sports Boosters Golf Tournament on September 19! It was a great and fun day with over 60 golfers. Thank you to Hole Sponsors, donors, and our Boosters officers for a great job. Go Braves!



HHS End of 1st Quarter is October 8

Our 1st Quarter will end on Friday October 8. As that day approaches, please review your child's progress and grades. If needed, have them speak with their teachers regarding tutoring, extra help, or missing assignments. Our teachers are keenly aware of those students that have been affected by quarantine. It is important for the students to have constant communication with the teachers through email or google classroom while on quarantine. Once they have returned, teachers will continue to show grace and offer the additional lesson information for the students benefit.

The grades from the 1st Quarter will be used for activity and athletic eligibility through the end of 1st Semester in December. Students must earn a 2.0 GPA in the 1st Quarter AND be less than 20 credits deficient to be eligible for extra-curricular activities. We have reached out to our athletic coaches with this information so that we are all aware of the academic necessities of our student-athletes and of student involved in clubs such as FFA.

Covid Quarantine Information

Since our return to in-person instruction last November 2020, we have worked very closely with the Glenn County Health Dept. to navigate with accurate information about required quarantine when a student or family members have a positive test, or are determined to be a close contact. We are very appreciative of the close cooperation and communication with our school nurses and we have all worked many hours determining close contacts while following the set requirements set by CDPH. While the requirements have changed since those initial days and are continually being revised, please know that we are in constant involved conversations with our school nurses to ensure that our students and staff receive the most up-to-date quarantine health info to limit the potential exposure while also limiting the students time out of class. This is an ever changing and evolving process and we aim to provide our families with direct communication. While some requirements have been revised, and may continue to be, generally speaking it is 10 days of quarantine with a positive test or a determined close contact. HHS Booster Golf Tournament

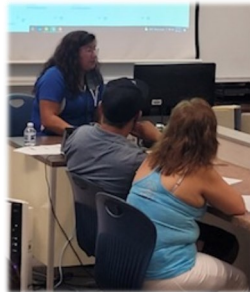
