#### OCTOBER IS BULLYING PREVENTION MONTH

#### **How to Prevent Bullying**

Parents, school staff, and other caring adults have a role to play in preventing bullying. They can:

- Help kids understand bullying. Talk about what bullying is and how to stand up to it safely. Tell kids bullying is unacceptable. Make sure kids know how to get help.
- Keep the lines of communication open. Check in with kids often. Listen to them. Know their friends, ask about school, and understand their concerns
- Encourage kids to do what they love. Special activities, interests, and hobbies can boost confidence, help kids make friends, and protect them from bullying behavior.
- Model how to treat others with kindness and respect.

#### Help Kids Understand Bullying

<u>Kids who know</u> what bullying is can better identify it. They can talk about bullying if it happens to them or others. Kids need to know ways to safely stand up to bullying and how to get help.

- Encourage kids to speak to a trusted adult if they are bullied or see others being bullied. The adult can give comfort, support, and advice, even if they can't solve the problem directly. Encourage the child to report bullying if it happens.
- Talk about how to stand up to kids who bully. Give tips, like using humor and saying "stop" directly and confidently. Talk about what to do if those actions don't work, like walking away
- Talk about strategies for staying safe, such as staying near adults or groups of other kids.
- Urge them to <u>help kids who are bullied</u> by showing kindness or getting help.
- Watch the short <u>webisodes</u> and <u>discuss them PDF</u> with kids.

- \* Increase ADA Goal is 95%




• Students will have an average mastery of 80% or higher of skills during scheduled intervention time.

### **Strategies for Including Parents in Homework**

An essential strategy for including parents in homework is sharing a responsibility to help children meet educational goals. Parents' commitment to prioritizing their child's educational goals, and participating in homework supports a larger objective. Teachers and parents are specific about the goals and work directly with the child with classwork and homework. Teachers and parents collaboratively working together on children's goals have larger and more long-lasting success. This also allows parents to be strategic with homework assistance.

Exact Path Skills Mastered by Grade – Students in K have 100 min available for Exact path Weekly, 1-8 200 min. Students should be averaging 5 skills per subject area miniumum.


