MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL DUNGEY

Our goal this year is to ensure that every student attends school regularly. Our goal is to reduce our chronic absenteeism from 45% to 30%!

We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss too much school — regardless of the reason — it can cause them to fall behind academically.

Research shows:

- Children chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade are much less likely to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade.
- By 6th grade, chronic absence is a proven early warning sign for students at risk for dropping out of school.
- By 9th grade, good attendance can predict graduation rates even better than 8th grade test scores.

Absences can add up quickly. A child is chronically absent if he or she misses just two days every month!!

Clearly going to school regularly matters!

Here are a few practical tips to help support regular attendance:

- Make sure your children keep a regular bedtime and establish a morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Ensure your children go to school every day unless they are sick.
- Avoid scheduling vacations or doctor's appointments when school

PERFORMANCE

- NWEA MAP Growth 65% of students will meet/exceed their projected growth in reading and math from Fall to Spring
- M-STEP proficiency increase student proficiency in math and reading by 20% per each content area-(rdg-20%/math 20%-both)- as compared to the previous year
- *PSAT –Increase the college readiness by 20% as compared to the previous year.

ATTENDANCE

- Chronic absenteeism and tardies Decrease by 15% in comparison to the previous year's rate (both CA and Tardies)
- * Increase ADA Goal is 95%

INTERVENTION

• Students will have an average mastery of 80% or higher of skills during scheduled intervention time.

EVERYday counts attendance matters

Don't let your child get left behind. Students who miss school, miss out.

- If your child frequently misses school during kindergarten and first grade, they are at risk for delayed reading.
- If your child frequently misses school during the formative elementary and middle school years, they become high risk for dropping out before graduation.
- In fact, good attendance is one of the best predictors a predictor more accurate than test scores - that your child will graduate from high school, pursue college and keep a job!


C 3 – Math Students are trending down with their completion of C3's this week!


