Dear Haldane Community,

We are pleased to share our October newsletter, highlighting recent accomplishments and special events that make Haldane such a remarkable school district. We would also like to extend our sincere gratitude to our partner organizations and community volunteers for their invaluable support, which has areatly enriched our students' experiences.

On Tuesday, November 19th, our district will hold a Capital Project Bond Referendum Vote on a \$28.4 million proposal. This project addresses critical site enhancements, safety upgrades, and infrastructure improvements. It also adds essential classroom and faculty spaces to support collaboration among students and staff. With over 20 years since our last major capital project, this decision represents an important opportunity to proactively address facilities needs and shape our district's future.

The statewide program began in 2012 as a partnership between nonprofit group GrowNYC and the NYC Office of Food Policy. Over 2.3 million New Yorkers participated in 2023, vying for a chance to win \$1,000 toward a school garden.

With the help of Haldane parent, Aaron Ernst, volunteers worked the day before to clean 350 New York apples donated by Fishkill Farms. Mrs. Jamin prepped the space by outlining a giant apple on Haldane Elementary's lawn where students and staff met to take a synchronized apple bite.




This Month in Middle School
