GRADE POINT SYSTEM

Previously, Carrollton reported both a weighted and unweighted average. Honors courses received an extra .5 and AP, AT and IB courses an additional 1.0. Beginning with the Class of 2022, Honors, AP, AT, and IB will no longer be awarded extra points when calculating a grade point average, and the grade point average we report will be unweighted.

RANK IN CLASS

Since Carrollton is small and strictly college preparatory, there is generally a negligible range in students' grade averages. Therefore, it is our school policy not to assign class rank.

HONOR SOCIETIES

Because Honor Societies require a service component, students may be active members in no more than three of the eight subject area honor societies and National Honor Society for a total of four commitments.


