
into our daily routines, we aim to create a supportive environment where every student feels empowered to navigate their emotional landscape and thrive both in and out of the classroom.

WHAT IS HABIT 3?

HABIT 3: PUT FIRST THINGS FIRST FOCUSES ON WORKING FIRST, THEN PLAYING. IT IS IMPORTANT TO IDENTIFY AND PRIORITIZE WHAT MATTERS MOST-YOUR "BIG ROCKS."

- BIG ROCKS: ESSENTIAL TASKS (E.G., SCHOOL WORK, FAMILY TIME, CHORES).
- <u>LITTLE ROCKS</u>: LESS IMPORTANT ACTIVITIES (E.G., WATCHING TV, GAMING).

HELPING YOUR CHILD

- ASK ABOUT THEIR KEY RESPONSIBILITIES
- ENCOURAGE DIFFICULT TASKS FIRST
- DISCUSS PROCRASTINATION AND ITS EFFECTS

PRIORITIZING FAMILY TIME

- CREATE A FAMILY MISSION STATEMENT
- SCHEDULE ONE-ON-ONE TIME AND REGULAR FAMILY MEALS
- ESTABLISH FAMILY TRADITIONS TO STAY CONNECTED

Attendance Notification Letters

Please be aware that all absences, whether excused or unexcused, are counted and can impact your child's progress. We understand that family commitments and emergencies arise, but we encourage you to plan vacations during our designated two-week breaks between quarters. This will help ensure that your child does not miss valuable instructional time and can return to school ready to learn. One way our district will keep you informed of your child's attendance is through attendance notification letters that are emailed to your ParentVue account.



Thank you for your support in prioritizing attendance. Together, we can help our students achieve their fullest potential.

From the Family Handbook:

Excused Absences

In cases involving prolonged illnesses, a written excuse from a physician may be requested to verify the absence. A student has an excused absence when one of the following conditions are met: When a student is not in attendance for any portion of or an entire school day and,

• The parent/guardian called the school's attendance line to report the student's absence within 24 hours and provided an acceptable excuse* for the absence, OR

• The parent/guardian was reached by the attendance office and provided the attendance office with an acceptable excuse* for the absence.

*Please note: we cannot excuse an absence that is reported via email; all absences must be reported to the school's attendance office via a telephone call.

Unexcused Absences

A student has an unexcused absence under and of the following conditions:

- When a student is not in attendance for any portion of or for an entire day and does not have an acceptable excuse*.
- The parent/guardian has not called the school's attendance office to report the student's absence and provide an acceptable excuse* within 24 hours.
- The parent/guardian cannot be reached by the attendance office to obtain an acceptable excuse* for the absence.

*The District will report all student absences and tardiness to school <u>in accordance with A.R.S.§ 15-901</u> (A)(1) and defined by the Arizona Department of Education.

Parent Reminders

Opt in for text communication

IMPORTANT: In the event of an emergency, text messages are the fastest and most effective way to communicate information to families. You must opt in to receive text communications! Text "Y" or "yes" to 67587 to begin receiving text messages from both your child's school and the Kyrene School District.

Birthday Celebrations

No celebrations of individual student birthdays are to be held in classrooms, on the school campus. We understand that parents and friends like to celebrate various occasions.

However, cakes, cookies, cupcakes, candy, flowers, balloons, etc. cause many distractions and cannot be allowed on campus or on the bus. These items are disruptive in the classroom and are a safety concern on the bus. If they are delivered they will be kept in the office for parents/guardians to pick up. This policy helps to ensure that instructional time is protected and that all students are treated equally. Party invitations may not be distributed at school.

Need to Report an Absence?

Call our 24 Hour Attendance Line at 480-541-4201 to report a student absence.

Please leave a message on the attendance line indicating the student's name, grade, date(s) and reason for absence. When your student is absent and we have not received notification, we will contact the parents. If we do not receive a return phone call, the student will be marked truant.

Note Parents MUST call the attendance line within 24 hours of an absence, even if you spoke to the Health Office or communicated to the Teacher.

Tardy

If your child is tardy, you must park in the parking lot and walk your child to the office. Sign them in and provide the reason why they are tardy. A tardy is defined as arriving at school or class after the scheduled start time. Students should be in their seats and ready to learn when the bell rings at the scheduled start time. Students are considered tardy if they are not in their seats at the scheduled start time. Mirada students need to arrive with enough time to make it to their classroom by 7:30am. Students who are tardy must enter through the school's front office and receive a Tardy pass.

Students and Electronic Devices

Many parents choose to have their child carry a cellular telephone or other electronic devices (such as an Apple watch or Fitbit) as a means of before and/or after school communication and for safety purposes. Electronic devices can be disruptive in an educational environment, but may also be used to enhance instruction. If parents have decided that it's necessary for a child to carry a cell phone or electronic device, parents and students must be aware of the following:

Kyrene School District Policy 3-401 states that the District does not assume responsibility for the loss of, or damage to, personal property. If your child has a cell phone on campus or on the bus and it is damaged or stolen, we will not be able to utilize administrative time to investigate the incident, nor will the District be able to take any financial responsibility for the cell phone or cell phone charges.

Cellular phones must be turned off and kept in backpacks at al times on campus, except for prior to the ringing of the first bell for the start of the instructional day and after the ringing of the last bell for the end of the instructional day.

This exception does not apply if the student is on the school bus. When appropriate, cell phones and other electronic devices may be used during the school day under the direct supervision of the teacher. If these rules are not followed, the cell phone may be confiscated and kept in the front office for pick up after school.

Please assist us in keeping our learning environment free from distractions. When it is necessary for a student to contact you during the day, we have telephones available in classrooms and in the office. If it is necessary for you to get an important message to your child during the school day, you may contact the school office and our staff will relay the message to your child.

• Students may bring large bills to pay for their meal account - please remember no change is provided back to the student, the entire amount is applied to the student's account.

- If a student does not have enough funds on their account, after two (2) meals (breakfast or lunch) they are provided an alternate meal as per District policy. The student may still get side options and salad bar along with their milk.
- Please remember that dietary restrictions must be accompanied by a Dr's note and will be accommodated to the best of our ability. SFE is unable to honor preferences or requests.
- You may check your student's lunch balance by visiting <u>linqconnect</u>. Linq Connect is our self-service lunch account portal, which makes it possible for Kyrene families to easily manage their student(s) lunch account. <u>Families may check meal balances</u>, transfer funds, apply for free or reduced-priced meals or <u>create spending limits</u> for their students by <u>visiting linqconnect</u>. For any additional questions or assistance with your linqconnect account please call 1-844-467-4700 and follow the prompts. Payments are applied to your student's meal account at 6:50am, 9:35am, 11:05am, 12:05pm and 11:35pm daily to update the meal account balance.
- Kyrene and SFE want to assure you that when your child chooses to enjoy ala carte snacks from their cafeteria, they are selecting options that meet the strict nutritional standards outlined by the USDA's Smart Snack guidelines. These guidelines prioritize offering snacks that are lower in fat, sugar, and sodium, while also providing essential nutrients to support your child's overall health and well-being. The guidelines require that drinks be either unflavored water or 100% juice, and that snacks contain at least 50% whole grain or list the first ingredient as a fruit, vegetable, dairy food, or protein food.

It's also important to note that while some snack packaging may appear similar to those found in stores outside of school, each product has been carefully reformulated to comply with federal Smart Snack guidelines. Our foodservice management company, SFE, works diligently to ensure that all snacks offered to students are both delicious and nutritious, meeting or exceeding federal standards.

We encourage you to discuss with your child the importance of making mindful choices when it comes to snacking. By reinforcing healthy eating habits both at home and at school, we can collectively support our children in making nutritious choices that contribute to their overall growth and development.
