Course: Music 4 Grade Level: 4

Content Area: Arts and Humanities

Frequency: Full-Year Course, Class held once per 5-day cycle

Big Ideas

- 1. Prepare, present, practice, and improvise hand signs and pitches in the major scale, introducing fa and ti pitches.
- 2. Prepare, present, practice, and improvise rhythms, including du, du-de, quarter rest, half note, half rest, whole note, whole rest, dotted half note, sixteenth notes, and syn co pa.
- 3. Identify and define symbols found in written music to prepare form, instruments, etc.
- 4. Establish breath, posture, tone, expression, and music-reading techniques through choral repertoire and performance.

Essential Questions

- 5. What are different ways to explore and improvise tuneful singing, both in unison and in part singing?
- 6. How can we visually demonstrate and notate rhythmic and melodic concepts?
- 7. How can we implement music literacy skills to improve vocal performances?
- 8. How can we begin the dialogue of analyzing, describing, and evaluating music?
