St. George's Episcopal School 2024 Summer Reading for Students Entering Sixth Grade

You will read TWO books this summer, one required text and one chosen from the list below.

There is no required written assignment to complete during the summer itself. We will, however, be using these titles as the basis for graded literature activities during the first quarter of 6th grade, so please complete the required books before the first day of school.

REQUIRED READING: Out of My Mind by Sharon Draper

All rising 6^{th} graders should read this book before the first day of school. We will be using it as a jumping-off point for our language arts studies during the first quarter of 6^{th} grade.

THERE IS NO WRITTEN ASSIGNMENT FOR STUDENTS TO COMPLETE DURING THE SUMMER.

READING HELP: If you would like to complete an activity to accompany your reading and keep the book fresh in your mind, you may be interested in one of the following. **This is not in any way required. It will not be collected or graded!**

- Create a scrapbook for Melody. Include pictures and key phrases to depict a minimum of five scenes. Write the chapter number of each scene you include on your drawings. For each scene, write 2 sentences explaining why that scene is important to the story.
- Write a one-sentence summary for each chapter. Also, choose one character who stood out to you the most, and write a paragraph describing what the character is like and why they caught your attention. Use at least 2 examples from the book to show what you mean.

CHOICE TITLES: CHOOSE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING TO READ.

You are required to read a second book this summer. Your chosen title will serve as the basis for an introductory literature assignment during the first quarter of 6^{th} grade. You may choose from the following list. Parents are encouraged to preview any titles their kids may wish to read.
