

Don't you just love chapel? I really love chapel because we get to worship God and learn Bible verses!



# RECIPE OF THE MONTH

#### **Pumpkin Bread**

This pumpkin bread recipe tastes amazing! It will warm you up no matter what. There's nothing I love more on a crisp fall day, and so will you!

#### Ingredients:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1½ cups granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoons baking soda
- 1¼ teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/8 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 3 large eggs
- 1 15-ounce can pumpkin puree



#### Directions:

- 1) Go ahead and preheat your oven to  $350^{\circ}$  and get out 2 bread loaf pans and spray nonstick spray on them.
- 2) Put the flour, sugar, baking soda, salt, baking powder, and spices into. a large bowl. Whisk them together until all the ingredients are combined.
- 3) In a different bowl whisk the pumpkin puree, oil, and eggs together. Whisk until all the ingredients are combined. Add the wet ingredients to the flour mixture and fold together.
- 4) Divide batter evenly among the 2 loaf pans. Place in the oven and bake for 45-55 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out clean when inserted in the middle of the loaf.
- 5) Let cool for 10 minutes, put the loaf on a plate or platter and enjoy!







Horry County located in Conway made it so that during the month of October, their city would be named "City of Halloween."


## How many people don't celebrate Halloween?



# Advice Colymn


