

Kindergarten students visited the Oriskany fire house in October to learn about fire safety and prevention.












Prek Visits the Nurse's Office


September/October Art Creations

In art, fourth graders used gears as their inspiration. Students created compositions full of overlapping and movement. They also played deal or no deal with Spirograph.


