At Home

- Read with your child for 15-20 minutes daily.
- Reinforce citizenship in order to benefit students at school.

Students

Crestview students worked with teachers to develop ideas about how they can be successful in school. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Talk with my family about what I am reading/learning in class
- Ask parents for help with homework assignments
- Bring home notices about family fun activities
- Read nightly with my family for 15-20 minutes
