

ST. HELENS PARKS & RECREATION



St. Helens Youth Basketball sign-ups are now open for kids in kindergarten to sixth grade with both kindergarten through second grade and third through sixth grade leagues! This year's registration deadline is November 15.

K-2nd grade league begins January 11 and continues through February 22. This league focuses on skills and drills, with practices and scrimmages on Saturdays.

The registration fee for the K-2nd grade league is \$50 and includes a shirt. This league is made possible by high school students and volunteers.

The 3rd-6th grade league season begins in December and continues through March. Games start on January 11th for 8-weeks and will travel between neighboring towns. Registration is \$80 per player. Reversible jerseys are available for \$25. If you have a previous year's jersey, you may continue to use that instead of purchasing a new jersey.

This is a non-competitive youth basketball league with an emphasis on fun and skill development. All games will be held on Saturdays, generally between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Separate practice times will be held during the week at various St. Helens School District facilities depending on the age group.

PARENTS! Please consider being a volunteer coach! Our leagues heavily rely on volunteers for the success of our programs. Volunteer coaches are required to pass a background check before the season starts, and we ask that they devote two hours during the week for team practices and one hour on Saturdays for games.
