

Hacienda La Puente Unified Expands Arts Education with New Programs, Bringing Transformative Opportunities for Students

Hacienda La Puente Unified School District (HLPUSD) is expanding its Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) program thanks to \$2.7 million in funding from Proposition 28, the California Department of Education's Arts and Music in Schools initiative, strengthening art, dance, music, and theatre arts instruction across the District.

HLPUSD has launched new arts programs across all grade levels as part of a five-year strategic plan. As part of the plan, students in TK through fifth grade at all 17 elementary schools now receive tailored instruction in art, dance, and music. Thanks to Prop 28 funds, HLPUSD hired 12 new VAPA instructors at elementary schools, ensuring creativity remains a key part of education for its youngest learners.

Additionally, all District second grade students are taking part in a 12-week theater arts residency, culminating in a studentwritten performance aligned with English language arts standards. HLPUSD fourth graders also now have the option to participate in a strings program with a fully developed orchestra, with the program set to expand to include all fourth through 12th graders in the District by 2030.

"Expanding our VAPA offerings is a transformative step for our District," VAPA Coordinator Dr. Benita Scheckel said. "We are creating adults who are creative, collaborative, out-of-the-box critical thinkers ready to communicate kindness, empathy, and sensitivity in a rapidly ever-changing global environment."

The project, financed by the District's general fund, was designed to enrich the playground experience for all students with the new space featuring a range of accessible equipment tailored to individuals with physical disabilities. The welcoming outdoor space—designed by the District's Executive Director of Special Education, Dr. Mayra Helguera—offers a variety of play options, including traditional and wheelchair-accessible swings, slides, sensory play areas, and an inclusive merry-go-round.

"Seeing some children unable to enjoy a traditional playground fully has always been disheartening," Helguera said. "This project reflects our deep commitment to building a community where every student, of all abilities, is valued, included, and empowered to thrive."

HLPUSD Celebrates Dual Triumphs: La Puente Warriors and Wilson Wildcats Conclude 9-1 Seasons, Gear Up for CIF Playoffs

Hacienda La Puente Unified is celebrating a remarkable achievement as both La Puente High School and Glen A. Wilson High School football teams concluded the regular season and head into the California Interscholastic Federation Southern Section (CIF-SS) playoffs with impressive 9-1 over<u>all records</u>.

Both teams will hit the road for their respective first-round challenges in the CIF-SS playoffs on Friday, November 8. Despite a narrow loss to Duarte that resulted in a shared league title, the Warriors are now focused on taking on Gahr High School in the opening game of the CIF-SS Division 13 Championships. The Warriors are calling on the community to rally behind them during this crucial away game at 11111 Artesia Blvd., Cerritos.

Meanwhile, the Glen A. Wilson Wildcats will head to the High Desert to face Yucca Valley High School (7600 Sage Ave., Yucca Valley) in CIF-SS Division 12 action. The Wildcats secured the Montview League Championship with a perfect 5-0 record for the second consecutive year. "I am so proud of my athletes for all their hard work, toughness and sacrifice displayed throughout the season," Glen A. Wilson High School head coach Charles Lewis said. "After suffering a tough loss in week zero, the team used that as motivation, fueling us to a successful regular season with big wins over Rowland High 36-22 and Nogales High 52-36."

The La Puente Warriors clinched the Miramonte League Championship for the first time since 2012, highlighted by a thrilling 28-27 victory over Garey High School on October 25. Under the leadership of first-year head coach Erick Morales, the Warriors showcased exceptional skill and resilience throughout the season. They opened league play with a commanding 53-6 win against Workman High and followed up with a decisive 50-0 victory over Bassett High.

"I am so proud of the heart, teamwork and dedication our student-athletes have shown this year," Morales said. "We faced adversity and triumphed and look forward to the playoffs. Let's go, Warriors!"
