Today's Gospel Reading

Reflection: Today's Gospel is about Jesus' radical style of leadership. Remember he said, "I do not come to be served, but to serve"? Worldly leaders can use their influence unjustly and feel entitled to rewards and privileges simply because of their position. The way of Jesus suggests that serving others is a privilege in itself and no reward is necessary.

Question: I reflect on Jesus' teaching. How do I find it? Does it resonate with me or do I find it hard to apply? When I am serving others do I seek rewards?

Prayer: O Lord, God Almighty, help me to do my duty- to serve you, and the people I encounter, with compassion and humility. Help me to take joy in working for your Kingdom of Justice and Peace, and to do it without seeking reward or privilege. Help the world leaders and politicians realize that they too are mere servants, as we work toward a world of peace and equality. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
