Blue Horizons Elementary -

Executive Director Shawn Banzhaf, from the Pat Tillman Veterans Center (PTVC) at ASU, spoke to the 6th through 8th grade students, as well as other veterans who were in attendance at the assembly. The morning assembly began with the Star Spangled Banner, Armed Melodies, and JROTC's Pageant of the Flags.

Estrella Mountain - The student council at EMES sponsored a Veteran's Day breakfast early in the morning for all to attend.

Freedom - Freedom Elementary hosted a celebratory event for all students mid-morning. Classes also held their own individual celebrations to commemorate this day.

Las Brisas - Prior to dismissal, Las Brisas Academy held an event on their basketball courts. The LBA band played a song, there was a table presentation to honor veterans; by honoring those veterans in attendance by branch. First graders then sang a song to the veterans, before concluding the event with a social meet and greet with refreshments.

Rainbow Valley - Rainbow Valley Elementary held a special Veterans Day Breakfast in the morning. Each class then commemorated the day special to their classroom.

Westar - The students and staff of Westar Elementary celebrated during a morning parade throughout the Estrella community near the Safeway. Westar also held a schoolwide morning assembly and 4th graders held small group interactions to conclude the morning's festivities.
