

Heart Safe School Designation Letter to School Community

Dear Community,

Horizons Elementary School is pleased to inform you that we have joined a community effort to implement a sustainable and comprehensive CPR and AED program. This decision is the result of our wish to make our buildings safe for our students, visitors and employees.

Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) occurs when the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating, cutting off blood flow to the brain and other vital organs. SCA is fatal if not treated immediately. Having access to an AED as well as having a written plan and a team of CPR/AED-trained staff ready to act in an emergency can save the life of someone suffering a SCA during those critical first few minutes. Through our cooperative efforts with **Project ADAM** and **Children's Hospital of Wisconsin**, we have joined hundreds of schools throughout the state of Wisconsin and beyond in preparing our school for a life-threatening emergency. This program enables us to offer any person who may experience a Sudden Cardiac Arrest during regular school hours, the best chance for survival.

Horizons currently has an AED in the building. The AED is stored in a wall cabinet. When the cabinet door is opened, a loud alarm will sound. This alerts everyone that there is a potential emergency. Our school has a maintenance plan in place for the units. The AEDs are designed to work effectively unless they are tampered with. Additionally, the AED will not shock a person unless it detects a shockable rhythm (ventricular fibrillation).

Staff has been trained to assist with an emergency during regular school hours. After school hours and during the summer, this is a Public Access Defibrillation (PAD) program. If you suspect someone is experiencing a Sudden Cardiac Arrest, please feel free to use the equipment at our school. Good Samaritan laws protect the layperson in a life-saving attempt, although we recommend becoming trained in CPR/AED use as an investment in your health and the health of others. Our local Emergency Medical Services and AASD Medical Director are aware of our procedures for the program.

"Project ADAM is a national, non-profit organization committed to saving lives through advocacy, education, preparedness and collaboration to prevent sudden cardiac death. Our affiliate programs improve the cardiac chain of survival in schools and communities in memory of Adam Lemel, a 17-year-old Whitefish Bay, WI, high school student who collapsed and died while playing basketball at school."

November—Diabetes Awareness Month

Diabetes is a chronic condition that occurs when the body can't produce enough insulin or can't use insulin properly, resulting in high blood sugar levels.

Where does insulin come from and what role does it play? Insulin is a hormone produced by the pancreas. It helps move sugar from the bloodstream into the body's cells to be used for energy. Think of this whole process like a lock and key system. Imagine that the body's cells have locked doors and insulin is the key that opens the locks to allow the sugar in. The pancreas is the company that makes the keys.

What happens to insulin in diabetes? There are three types of diabetes: Type 1, Type 2 and gestational diabetes. Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune condition where the body mistakenly attacks the cells in the pancreas that create insulin. Eventually the pancreas can't make insulin anymore or can't make enough to keep up with the body's needs. The company has stopped manufacturing keys so there are little to no keys available to open the locks. In Type 2 diabetes, the body produces insulin but cannot use it properly. The company is still making keys but the locks are rusty so the keys don't open the locks as well. Gestational diabetes is a type of diabetes that occurs when a pregnant person is unable to produce enough insulin or use the insulin effectively. There are not enough keys and some of the locks are rusty.

What are the common symptoms of diabetes? Per the American Diabetes Association, some common symptoms of diabetes include:

- Urinating often
- Feeling very thirsty
- Feeling very hungry even though you are eating
- Extreme fatigue
- Blurry vision
- Cuts/bruises that are slow to heal
- Weight loss even though you are eating more (type 1)
- Tingling, pain, or numbness in your hands/feet (type 2)

Can diabetes be prevented? There is currently no known way to prevent Type 1 diabetes. Things that can help to lower chances of developing Type 2 diabetes include eating healthy, being active, and maintaining a healthy weight. Noviembre: Mes de Tomar Conciencia sobre la Diabetes

La diabetes es una afección crónica que ocurre cuando el cuerpo no puede producir suficiente insulina o no puede usarla adecuadamente, lo que resulta en niveles altos de azúcar en la sangre.

¿De dónde viene la insulina y qué papel juega? La insulina es una hormona producida por el páncreas. Ayuda a transportar el azúcar del torrente sanguíneo a las células del cuerpo para utilizarlo como energía. Piense en todo este proceso como un sistema de cerradura y llave. Imagine que las células del cuerpo tienen puertas cerradas y la insulina es la llave que abre las cerraduras para permitir la entrada del azúcar. El páncreas es la empresa que fabrica las llaves.

¿Qué sucede con la insulina en la diabetes? Hay tres tipos de diabetes: tipo 1, tipo 2 y diabetes gestacional. La diabetes tipo 1 es una enfermedad autoinmune en la que el cuerpo ataca por error a las células del páncreas que crean insulina. Con el tiempo, el páncreas ya no puede producir insulina o no puede producir la suficiente para satisfacer las necesidades del cuerpo. La empresa ha dejado de fabricar llaves, por lo que hay pocas o ninguna llave disponible para abrir las cerraduras. En la diabetes tipo 2, el cuerpo produce insulina pero no puede utilizarla adecuadamente. La empresa todavía fabrica llaves, pero las cerraduras están oxidadas, por lo que las llaves no abren las cerraduras también. La diabetes gestacional es un tipo de diabetes que ocurre cuando una persona embarazada no puede producir suficiente insulina o usarla de manera efectiva. No hay suficientes llaves y algunas cerraduras están oxidadas.

¿Cuáles son los síntomas comunes de la diabetes?

Según la Asociación Estadounidense de Diabetes, algunos síntomas comunes de la diabetes incluyen:

- Orinar con frecuencia
- Sentir mucha sed
- Sentir mucha hambre aunque estés comiendo
- Fatiga extrema

- Visión borrosa
- Cortes/moretones que tardan en sanar
- Pérdida de peso aunque estés comiendo más (tipo 1)
- Hormigueo, dolor o entumecimiento en las manos/pies (tipo 2)

¿Se puede prevenir la diabetes? Actualmente no se conoce ninguna forma de prevenir la diabetes tipo 1. Las cosas que pueden ayudar a reducir las posibilidades de desarrollar diabetes tipo 2 incluyen comer sano, estar activo y mantener un peso saludable. La Asociación Estadounidense de Diabetes ofrece una prueba gratuita de riesgo de diabetes tipo 2 de 60 segundos.

Thank you for your interest in the YMCA Program at Horizons, an AASD Extended Day Learning Program. Please refer to the below information for registration purposes.

General program information:

- The registration fee of \$35 per child must be paid online when you complete your registration process. This is a Non-Refundable fee.
- Depending on your free/reduced status, there are monthly fees to both the before and after school program. Please see the bottom of this letter for the monthly rates, these are per child.
- Before school runs 6:30am until school starts and after school runs from dismissal until 6:00pm.
- When registering, please use a laptop or computer. A phone is not advised.

New Families:

- The registration process does take about 30 minutes per child as our system requires you to enter children's health history, emergency contacts and immunization records. Please plan accordingly. You are able to save the information and come back at a later time, if needed.
