School Community

Crystal Lake South High School is a public, four-year high school with an enrollment of 1,236 students. Located approximately 45 miles northwest of Chicago, the school serves the cities of Crystal Lake and Lake in the Hills. Crystal Lake South offers a comprehensive curriculum and extracurricular activities to help students expand their academic and social skills, learn about themselves, engage in positive experiences, and be involved with community outreach. There are 24 varsity sports, one club sport, and 35 school activities.


Crystal Lake South is consistently ranked among the best public high schools nationally and in the state of Illinois. Most recently, U.S. News & World Report named it among the nation's best high schools in 2023. Chicago Magazine ranked South as the best high school in McHenry County and Niche ranked District 155 as the best district in McHenry County.

In District 155, 83% of teachers hold a master's degree. The teacher-student ratio is 20:1. The school also employs five counselors, two social workers, one nurse, and one psychologist on its student services team.

Community High School District 155 includes four comprehensive high schools and one alternate education campus. Serving grades 9-12, each institution has full State of Illinois recognition and accreditation. Enrollment includes approximately 5,400 students from McHenry and Lake counties.


