Five students who had an IEP or 504 plan graduated from Belfast June 28; the numbers as of 7/1/24 reflect seniors being moved out of the system.

## **2023-24 Placement of Students with Disabilities**

### School-Age Students

- 6 students were placed in CA BOCES programs outside the building
- 4 students were placed in GV programs outside the building
- 7 students received services in the BCS 12:1:1 class
  - 2 additional out-of-districts students were also in the class
- 61 students received services at BCS

### Pre-School

- 3 students were on a wait list for 12:1:1 class placements because classes were full
- 11 BCS preschoolers with disabilities were in the UPK program
  - 1 out-of-district UPK student also received CPSE services
- 1 preschool student received services at home

### Parentally Placed Students

- There are currently students attending GV and Andover for whom we have CSE/CPSE responsibility for holding their meetings and creating their plans.
