## Hudson City Schools Receives 5-Star Ranking

Hudson is proud to be one of only 18 districts in the state to receive a Five Star Excellence rating in all five components on the Ohio Report Card, which was released in September. The five areas are: Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Graduation, and Early Literacy.

In addition, our Performance Index score of 106.9 earned us a ranking of #14 out of 607 public school districts. Hudson is ranked #1 among Summit County school districts. The index measures the level of achievement of every student, not just whether they score a proficient level on the state tests.



## **Hudson Boasts 26 National Merit Scholars**

Hudson High School is proud to announce 26 seniors have been named to the 2025 National Merit Scholarship Program.

Nine seniors are National Merit-Semifinalists, meaning they are among the top 1% nationally to earn this prestigious honor, based on their junior PSAT scores. These academically talented high school seniors now have an opportunity to continue in the competition for scholarship money.

The other 17 seniors are Commended Scholars, who scored in the top 3–4% on the qualifying PSAT test. Although they are not eligible for a National Merit Scholarship, they can still become candidates for special scholarships provided by business and corporate sponsors.

# Harmony: Performing Arts Project Gets Underway

The Harmony: Performing Arts Project is moving ahead, as the district plans for the addition of a 5,000 square foot orchestra room at Hudson High School, as well as renovations to the band and choir rooms.

The project also involves a renovation of the auditorium to a state-of-the-art facility. This will include new seating, acoustic upgrades, new stage and house LED lighting, mid-house station, and more.

Harmony is a \$5.5 million project, and joint venture of public and private funds. The John and Alison Quagliata Foundation is a Harmony Founding Member for its generous \$1 million donation to the project.
