Alumni Spotlight: CLAUDE STUART '90 Professional Comedian

As a member of the class of 1990, Gow alumnus, comedian, producer, and writer Claude Stuart IV '90 has been entertaining audiences on the stage, over the airwaves, and in the writers' room for nearly three decades. Speaking to us, he opened with a joke: "I live in 'Beverly Hills Adjacent.' 'I love telling people that, because it sounds so much nicer than 'Behind the Walgreens'."

A native of Greenville, Mississippi, Claude, who has dyslexia, attended Gow for high school. He says that at the time, study hall and Saturday classes were not his favorite activities but proved essential when he moved on to college at Southern Methodist University (SMU) in Dallas and, later, his storied comedy career.

"Gow taught me discipline and how to get my work done, and that's what I did in college. The result? I earned a 3.3 GPA in college – the ultimate score for a person with dyslexia," he said. "Gow taught me to plan what I need to do and achieve it." At SMU, Claude majored in communications with a focus on radio and TV and was named "The Funniest Person at SMU." He also worked at a local radio station, where he got his first real experience in the entertainment business. As a joke, he secretly called into the radio station and took on the different personas of "listeners." The bit took off, and upon discovery by management, instead of getting fired, he became a mainstay writing scripts and co-hosting the morning show.

Claude's big break came after, in his words, "prematurely" moving to LA, where while doing odd jobs, he met Saturday Night Live alum Dennis Miller's writers who offered him an internship. "I learned the mechanics of joke writing and comedy production and made myself get up on stage at least three times a week," he said. Soon, Claude appeared at comedy clubs across the country, and his career springboarded.

Claude's list of credits is considerable. In 2017, he began writing for the show "Funny You Should Ask", a daily comedy panel show where he quickly became known for his sharp wit, writing more than 600 jokes for the show-more than anyone else on the staff. During the pandemic, he wrote movies and TV shows that are now being developed, including "Standby", a film featuring Sean Astin and John Cleese, and "Killer Book Club", a dark comedy-thriller starring Monica Potter, Vivica A. Fox, Craig Robinson and Jamie Kennedy. Claude has his own production company and lives with his wife, Heather De Sisto, and their 10-year-old son, Claude Stuart V. Beverly Hills Adjacent may be across the country from his Govian roots, but he credits the school with giving him discipline, a work ethic and true friendships for a lifetime.

A sophomore from Williamsville, NY, Simon is an enthusiaic promoter of the Buffalo Naval Park, the largest inland naval park in the US. Located on Buffalo's waterfront, the Naval Park is home to four decommissioned military ships. Each year, thousands of visitors explore these historic vessels to appreciate Naval history and the dedication and challenges faced by veterans and service members.

Last summer, Simon worked as a volunteer junior docent and a paid overnight deckhand. As a docent, he leads daytime tours, sharing the history and operations of the ships. In the evenings, he assists overnight visitors, serving as a deckhand and helping by giving tours, preparing meals and runnng the ship. Learning from senior guides and vessel manuals, Simon has become an integral member of the park's operations team. On November 2, students from Gow visited the park and enjoyed having Simon serve as their guide.

In the future, Simon hopes to pursue a career as a defense contractor specializing in naval vessels, or to be a naval aviator.

Brian Benetiz '05 and his wife celebrated their son Gabriel's first birthday October 11th.


Price Combs '07 lives in Lexington, KY and works at the YMCA and as a soccer referee.
