Glen Cove is located on the North Shore of Long Island 27 miles east of New York City. It was founded in 1668 and now has an ethnically, economically and religiously diverse population of approximately 25,000 people.

The District - The Glen Cove School District was founded in 1830 and currently educates approximately 3,000 students in grades K-12 and Pre-K. It has six school buildings, including a Pre-K program; four elementary schools; one middle school, and one high school. Our enrollment by ethnicity is 66% Hispanic, 22% White, 7% African American, 3% Asian and 2% Multiracial.

The High School - Glen Cove High School has an enrollment of 1078 and is accredited by the University of the State of New York. The school year is 184 days, divided into two twenty week semesters. The school day is from 7:30 a.m. to 2:06 p.m., nine periods at 44 minutes each.

Special Programs - Action Learning: career oriented internships and volunteer work in community and schools for high school credit. STEP: Science, technology and engineering program in conjunction with New York Institute of Technology.

Community Service - At Glen Cove High School, students are enriched through community service opportunities. The amount of time served is calculated each year on the official transcript.

Grade Weighting - A weighted grade point average, calculated at the end of the 11th grade, is recorded on the transcript. Weighted offerings include 21 Advanced Placement & 20 Honors courses which are weighted as follows: 1.12 for Advanced Placement courses; 1.07 for honors courses and dual-enrolled college courses, and 1.00 for Regents level courses.

Ranking - Glen Cove does not rank students.
