their 9th grade year. We are confident that we can meet designation status with our Algebra 1 EOC assessment. Evaluating our Algebra 1 and TSIA scores can help us better understand if there is a need for implementation of additional support and test preparation for students to be successful at those assessments.

ECHS counselors will visit 8th grade students at Fredericksburg Middle School and St. Mary's Middle School starting December 1st to educate them on ECHS opportunities. NLC, FHS, and ECHS personnel will host a parent informational meeting at FMS on the evening of December 13th. On January 9th support will be available at FMS in the evening to guide parents and students through the application process and answer questions. Applications, which only cover basic student information, are due no later than January 19th. ECHS committee review will meet on February 1st for the lottery. Students and parents will be scheduled for individual interviews February 5th-February 9th.

Course Agreements are developed by the College and the School District for each dual credit course taught. The Course Agreements list the high school course that students will receive credit for upon completion of the college course. The College, School District, and School will ensure that the dual credit course and the corresponding high school course are equivalent.

The Northeast Lakeview College articulation agreement stipulates that designees from the College's Office of High School Programs and the School will be responsible for working to develop and refine a clear and coherent academic course sequence. Staff from the College Student Success office will provide students with academic advising on the chosen degree plan. All dual credit courses will be placed on transcripts immediately upon a student's completion of the performance required in the course. Students enrolled through the census date will have the courses recorded on their permanent student transcript. In addition, all students enrolled in high school dual credit programs have access to services similar to traditional college students who have graduated from high school.
