HARVESTING CRANBERRIES

Cranberries are small round fruits that are red in color. Many people think that cranberries are sour or bitter. You may eat cranberries during the fall months. You may even have cranberry bogs where you live. Massachusetts and Wisconsin are the most common states that have cranberry bogs. A bog is where cranberries are grown. Cranberries are harvested, or collected, from September through November. There are two common ways to harvest cranberries. Farmers either do dry harvesting or wet harvesting.

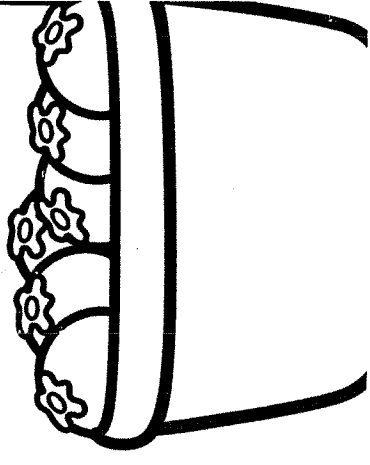
Dry Harvesting

Dry harvesting uses a machine to gather cranberries. The vines must be completely dry before they are harvested. A machine combs the berries from the vines. The berries then are put in burlap sacks. Burlap is a woven material that is very durable, or strong. Once the berries are collected in the sacks, a special vehicle or helicopter takes the berries from the bog. The sacks of berries are brought to a fresh fruit receiving station. This is where the cranberries are screened. Workers grade the berries based on their color and if they can bounce. Soft berries will not bounce and are discarded, or thrown out. Dry harvested berries are usually used for baking and cooking.

Wet Harvesting

Cranberries can float in water because they have pockets of air inside them. Some farmers fill their bogs with water to remove the berries from the vines. A machine called a water reel stirs the water in the bogs. As a result, the berries are lifted from the vines and begin to float. Farmers then use booms to round up the berries. A boom is a wooden or plastic bar that pushes the berries toward a conveyor belt. The berries are then transported to be cleaned. Cranberries that are wet harvested are used for juice, sauces, and other processed foods. Wet harvesting is more common than dry harvesting.

Cranberries can be enjoyed in many different ways. The way they are harvested determines how the cranberries will be used. If you are ever up north, be on the lookout for cranberry bogs!

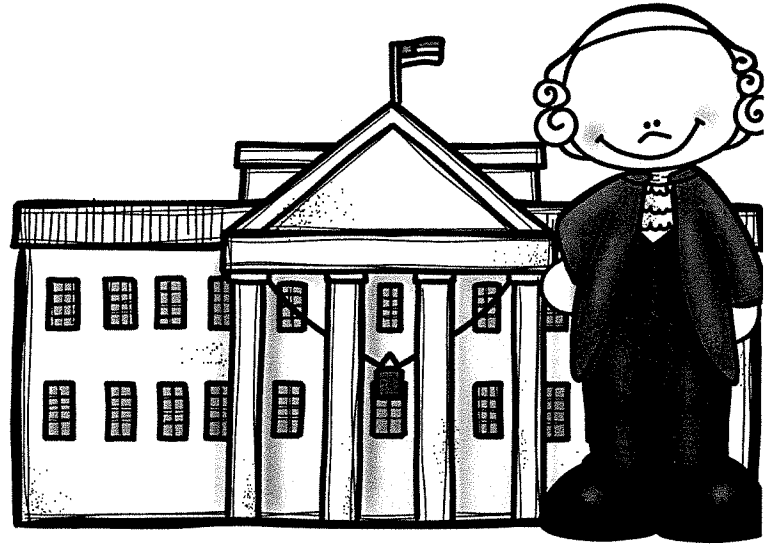
LEGISLATIVE

This is the Capitol Rotunda located in Washington, D.C. It represents the legislative branch of government. The legislative branch creates laws and sends them to the president.



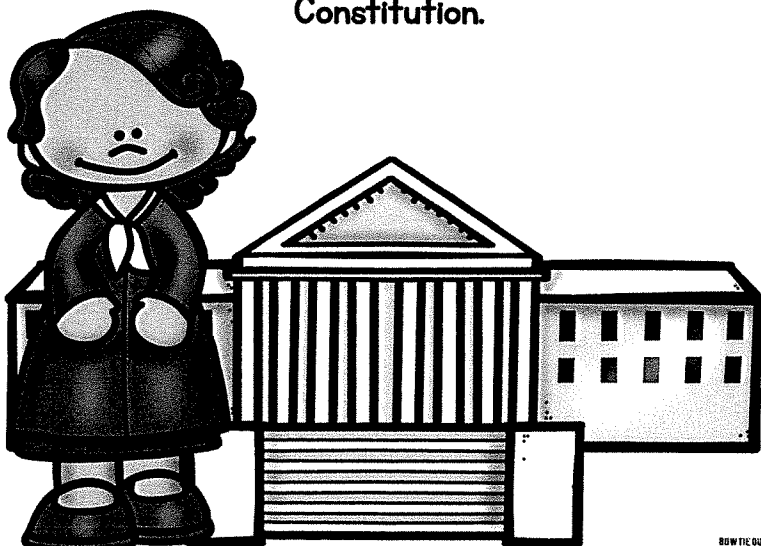
EXECUTIVE


