College Access Resources

As high school seniors prepare to attend college next year, there are resources available to help them afford their degree:

- <u>MassEducate</u> provides free tuition and fees at the state's community colleges for all eligible Massachusetts students.
- <u>MASSGrant Plus</u> provides free tuition and fees at the state's four-year universities for students whose families make up to \$85,000 a year before taxes. Tuition and fees are reduced by up to half for students whose families earn between \$85,000 and \$100,000 a year before taxes.
- Applying for financial aid at any college starts with completing the <u>Free Application for Federal</u> <u>Student Aid</u>. While that application is not available yet, students and families can apply now for the <u>Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID)</u> so that they will be ready when the application opens.
- Eligible, non-U.S. citizens can apply for state financial aid through the <u>Massachusetts Application for</u> <u>State Financial Aid (MASFA)</u>.
- <u>Information about applying for financial aid</u>, including <u>links to information</u> and <u>one-on-one help</u>, is available online.

• Nov 22nd is the deadline to register for the Dec 7th test


