- Community Center to remain open for Gym Members during regular business hours. Gym is not included in a full facility rental. Four (4) hour minimum rental.
- Security required for events after 4:00 p.m. Weekdays, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Fee contingent upon officer rates and will be reimbursed by contract holder.
