6. Action Items

6.01 <u>Follow-up to January 4, 2021 Board Meeting Regarding Virtual Instruction, January 5-15, 2021</u> Dr. Casteel apologized for the confusion in the community after the last meeting and admittedly should have read both options provided to the Board so the audience was aware of what the board was considering.

At this time, the administration recommended PK-12 grades resume in-person instruction on January 19, 2021 (after Martin Luther King Jr Holiday). She introduced Mr. Schlueter, Director of Elementary Education, and Amber Stouard, Director of Research & Assessment, to paint the full story, give rationale, and answer questions.

Amber Stouard explained that school choice is a core value of CUSD and reviewed the timeline and objectives. Leo Schlueter shared the 5 critical pieces of data to determine decisions for learning in detail: 1) Maricopa County Benchmarks; 2) School specific threshold using CUSD Dashboard; 3) Student considerations and needs; 4) Safety concerns and mitigation plans; and 5) CDC, State, and County health official recommendations. He presented the recommendation from administration that Chandler Unified School District resume in-person instruction for Pk-12 on Tuesday, February 19, 2021 with the following guidelines: 1) Continue to strengthen the mitigation plan and mask enforcement; and 2) Monitor all data measures a) county and local benchmarks; b) school thresholds; c) student considerations; d) CDC, state and county health official recommendations.

Move that our schools open for in-person learning on Tuesday, January 19, 2021.

6.01 <u>Follow-up to January 4, 2021 Board Meeting Regarding Virtual Instruction, January 5-15, 2021</u> (cont'd) Discussion:

Jason Olive asked about the waiting list for COA and administration explained that requests are being handled as they come in. There was a delay over the winter break while staff was getting settled per the requests.

Lindsay Love expressed her disappointment that there was not a virtual option offered, stating that COA is not a viable option for all families, that opportunity gaps have always existed, but we have an equity program. She stated that she could not support this option in secondary because strategies are not being followed and that Dr. Fauci recommends schools not open in a hot spot AND must follow mitigation strategies.

Laura Bruner feels that community spread must be controlled first, the data cannot be disregarded, that children spread as much as adults, and we are not looking at the comprehensive documents in the references of the presentation. She also stated multiple studies show that schools are the centers for spread in the community and that we don't have coverage for teachers, and this is an issue especially for first year teachers.

6.02 <u>School District Annual Expenditure Budget Revision #2</u>

In accordance with Arizona Statute ARS 15-905, the District can revise its budget up until May 15, 2021 for the 2020-2021 fiscal year. On December 16, 2020, the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) adjusted every district's maintenance and operations budget. The budget revision presented for approval reflects the distance learning reduction discussed during the December 9, 2020 Board meeting. Lana explained the additional expenses, reduction in funding and how numbers are based on the end of 2nd semester; there could be further losses, but the district will maximize every dollar.

Board members asked specific questions about how the budget loss would impact the district. Barb Mozdzen commented that next year is worrisome, stating budgets won't resolve if students don't return to the district and that many families have become frustrated with the District's decisions. Joel Wirth echoed that CUSD has never experienced laying off staff.

7.04 QuaverMusic Curriculum

On October 27th, 2020, the Curriculum Department submitted an RFI for Elementary (K-6) General Music. The Curriculum Department identified QuaverMusic to present to the Governing Board for use at all K-6 campuses beginning in the 2021-2022 school year. QuaverMusic develops online curriculum with a focus on general music education that combines engaging digital resources and ongoing professional development. The cost for a 5-year license is \$276,885.00 including tax and shipping and will be funded through the District Textbook budget. In accordance with A.R.S. 15-721, the curriculum will be placed on display for the 60-day public review period for comment at the Melinda Romero Instructional Resource Center starting January 14, 2021. After the 60-day review period for public comment, the curriculum will be presented for approval.

7.05 Policy GCQA - Professional Staff Reduction in Force Revision

Chandler Administration recommended changes to Policy GCQA - Professional Staff Reduction in Force as a result of reviewing the current policy. Revisions were presented to include job performance as an indicator for consideration in order to ensure that a quality workforce is maintained that will be able to perform the District's educational programs. Approval will be requested at the January 27, 2021 board meeting.

Laura Bruner asked why loyalty was not included in the policy. Dr. Nance explained that education, experience, training, past contributions, and achievements as educators are included and that tenure has not been included in the past. She also clarified that retirements, resignations and leaves will be taken into consideration, but it may require shifting some staff around.

7.07 Superintendent Comments

Dr. Casteel thanked the board, acknowledging the decisions are not easy. There is no consensus in the community. She looks forward to the time when decisions are celebrated and applauded by staff and families. CUSD is partnering with ASU for free saliva testing on weekends. Teachers and staff will have priority and it will be opened to the community on Thursdays and Fridays. We are also working on a partnership for vaccines to be administered on district sites to staff to accommodate as many as are willing to take the vaccine. She encouraged staff to participate for that layer of protection and acknowledged that some staff had already received immunizations. Dr. Casteel also confirmed that Dr. Nance and Sandy Cooper would be meeting again with support staff for a follow-up and Dr. Gilbert and Frank Narducci would meet with teachers again.

Jason Olive thanked the community for their comments through email and the website, explaining that there were so many he cannot respond to everyone. He tries to respond to some and assures they are all being read. He encouraged everyone to take care of each other as they get back into class. Joel Wirth acknowledged as a new board member, there had been two meetings with tough decisions.
