Bringing the Magic of Broadway to Edina

In the bustling halls of Normandale Elementary, music teacher Elizabeth Werness is orchestrating more than just melodies. This winter and spring she's leading a group of young thespians through the enchanting world of musical theater with a production of "Annie's Kids."

Werness, along with her daughter Tora, who serves as choreographer, and Sara, co-music director, meets with 2nd through 5th graders twice a week from January to April. The program, now in its fourth year at Normandale, culminates in performances at Southview Auditorium on April 28th and 29th.

"I remember growing up and participating in musical shows. It was the highlight of my year!" Werness reminisces. This passion for performance drives her to create similar opportunities for her students. Under her guidance, children learn not just their lines and choreography, but also the intricacies of stage production—from lighting and blocking to microphone use and dress rehearsals.

The program has seen remarkable growth since its inception. What started with 60 participants has blossomed to 140, with summer sessions added to meet demand. "We are able to give the students an on-site stage experience," Werness explains, her eyes sparkling with enthusiasm.

But for Werness, the real magic happens off-stage. "I love seeing the students in a different light," she says. The program offers a unique platform for children to discover hidden talents and build confidence. "It's amazing to see students feel

supported and feel that their hard work has paid off."

Perhaps most heartwarming is the cyclical nature of the program. Former students, now in middle and high school, return as mentors and technicians, fostering a sense of community and continuity.

As rehearsals progress, Werness observes a beautiful transition. "There is a distinct moment throughout the show process that it is no longer mine but it becomes the students'. It is their performance and their gift that they are giving the audience."

With "Annie's Kids" on the horizon and summer programs in the works, Werness continues to nurture young talent, one show at a time. Her ultimate goal? To create lasting memories and open doors to lifelong passions. As the curtain rises on another season, it's clear that under Werness's tutelage, the love for theater at Normandale Elementary is anything but a hard-knock life.

Community Service Letter Program

Edina High School students entering grades 9-12 can earn a letter in Community Service. Students can earn a letter by making a difference by serving their community and others.

Here are the steps required to earn a Community Service Letter:

1. Join the Community Service Letter Schoology page
2. Attend an in-person orientation (October)
3. Complete an application (due Friday, December 13, 2024)
4. Complete 120 hours of service with at least 60 hours addressing a specific social issue. Hours must be completed by Friday, April 11, 2025
5. By the April 11 deadline, students will submit the following materials on Schoology:
 - Hours log demonstrating 120 hours of service
 - One letter of recommendation from a supervisor with an organization you volunteered with
 - A Creative Reflection artifact that represents your service work
6. Students share the creative artifact and service experiences in a reflection session with peers (April/May 2025).

Homemade French Crackers

Ingredients:

1½ cups all-purpose flour
 ½ cup Parmesan cheese (*grated*)
 1 teaspoon sugar
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 teaspoon dried basil
 ½ teaspoon dried thyme
 ¼ teaspoon garlic powder
 2½ tablespoons olive oil
 ½ cup & 2 tablespoons water
 1 tablespoon poppy seeds
 1 tablespoon sesame seeds
 1 teaspoon flaky salt (*or coarse*)

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 450 degrees
2. Mix together flour, Parmesan, sugar, salt, basil, thyme, and garlic powder
3. Stir in olive oil and water until a ball of dough forms—add more water/olive as needed for desired consistency
4. Roll out dough until it's about ⅛-inch thick (or less).
5. Cut dough into rectangle strips and add strips to a baking sheet pan
6. Sprinkle toppings of choice: poppy seeds, sesame seeds & flaky salt
7. Bake until edges are browned, for 13-15 min
8. Cool crackers on a baking sheet, then serve immediately or store in an airtight container until ready to use. Enjoy!

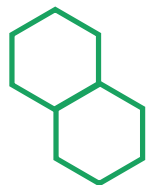

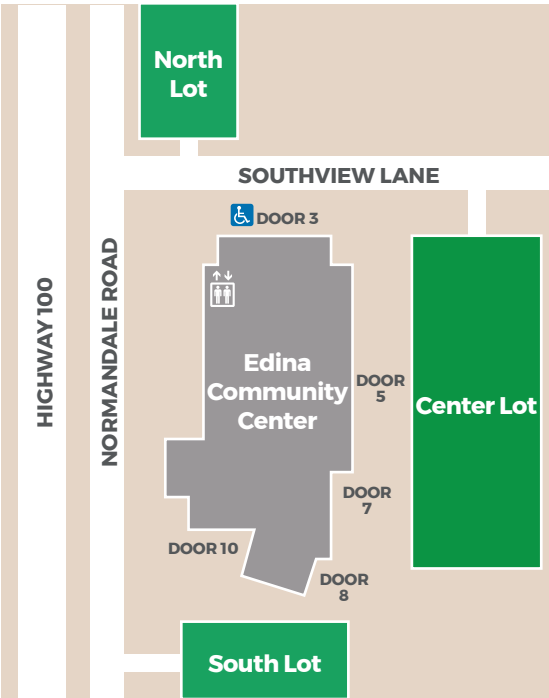
