



Attendance Matters when scholars are in school to hear the information Student Achievement increases. As of 11-8-24 19% of scholars are chronically absent meaning they are missing more than 10% of number of days we have been in school. Currently 19% of scholars have 4 or more absences as of 11-8-24. Below is a breakdown of the number of scholars in each grade that are chronically absent in blue out of total number of scholars in the grade level in red. 

Family Tree Project Due 11-25-24



Introduction to Family Tree: The presentation will start with an introduction to the concept of a Family Tree. It is important to capture the history and generation of your Family Tree. Photographs, heirlooms or items that are important to your family and generation will be accepted. Be creative with your poster boards, drawing etc,

K- 2nd is required to show a minimum of 2 generations of your family tree. Students should tell one fact about each generation! In addition, your project must include a statement of 1 to 2 sentences of who you're thankful for on your family tree. Why? Ex: " My grandmother and grandfather were married for 50 years. I am thankful to my grandfather for coming to all my football games." This is one generation now you will need a second great grandmother or great grandfather, mother, great aunties, uncles etc..

3rd- 5th grade is required to show a minimum of 3 generations of your family tree. Students should tell one fact about each generation! In addition, your project must include a summary of 3 to 5 sentences of who you're thankful for on your family tree. Why? Ex: " My grandmother and grandfather were married for 50 years. I am thankful to my grandfather for coming to all my football games." This is one generation now you will need a second great grandmother or great grandfather, mother, great aunties, uncles etc..

6th- 8th is required to show a minimum of 4 generations of your family tree. Students should tell one fact about each generation! In addition, your project must include a summary of 5 to 7 sentences of who you're thankful for on your family tree. Why? Ex: "My grandmother and grandfather were married for 50 years. I am thankful to my grandfather for coming to all my football games." This is one generation now you will need a second great grandmother or great grandfather, mother, great aunties, uncles etc..
