Ice Fishing

Have you ever been fishing? Chances are, if you have been fishing, you chose to go when the weather was warm. Many fishermen and women tend to fish in the summer, spring or fall months. And while people who fish might have stories of fishing in the hot sun or even the pouring rain, it might be harder for you to find someone who has gone ice fishing in the wintertime.


Ice fishing is a great way to take your fishing hobby into the winter months. Here in America, you can find ice fishers in the northern parts of the country. In the upper Midwest, for example, lakes freeze enough to keep fishermen safe and on top of the ice.

About one third of licensed fishermen and women in the northern parts of America go ice fishing. In fact, in the northern Midwest states, surveys have shown that ice fishing is ranked as the fourth favorite winter activity! Sledding, snowmobiling and ice skating were the only activities that beat it.

So what is ice fishing? Just because lakes freeze doesn't mean that the fish leave to go to warmer climates. Instead, the fish are still in the body of water, but just hanging out below the new ice that has frozen on the top of the lake. When anglers, or people who fish, want to go ice fishing, they must cut through the ice to make a hole to fish in. There are still plenty of fish to catch in the wintertime. People in Wisconsin catch an average of 14 million fish during ice fishing season!

Ice fishing requires a bit more safety precautions than regular fishing. Never go ice fishing alone if you are a beginner. It is important that you go with someone who is experienced and can show you how to be safe and keep you out of the freezing water. In order to be sure that ice will not crack when they walk on it, anglers pay careful attention to the signs and flags that are placed on bodies of water by the Department of Natural Resources. You should never walk on ice that is thin or unsafe.

If you love fishing and ever visit the northern parts of America during the wintertime, ice fishing might be something fun that you would enjoy watching or doing yourself.


