- 1. Welcome and Call to Order
- The meeting was called to order at 5:00 PM by Mr. Anderson.
- 2. Title 1 Impact Review
- The impact of Title 1 funding was discussed, including an overview of the Title 1 compact form.

Contact Form Overview

The Title 1 compact form is designed to foster collaboration between the school, families, and students by outlining shared responsibilities. The compact form includes the following commitments:

- Work together to improve the child's academic success.
- Ensure two-way communication with families throughout the school year.
- Create and maintain a positive learning environment for all students.
- Support the home-school partnership, strengthening cooperation for student growth and achievement.
- Title I schools are required to have a plan that outlines how the school will implement various Parent and Family Engagement Activities. This plan is to be developed jointly with parents and communicated in clear, accessible language. For families with English as a second language, the plan will be provided in multiple languages.
 - The Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP) will be available on the school's website and will also be shared during SAC meetings.

- 3. School Improvement Plan Review
- Mrs. Nuenfeldt provided an in-depth review of the School Improvement Plan (SIP).
- All schools in the district have School Improvement Plans, and in Title I schools, this plan also serves as the Title I Plan.

- The Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP) is developed using the objectives and goals from the SIP, alongside parent and stakeholder input. This plan details the parent and family engagement events supported through Title I funding.
- A minimum of 1% of all Title I funds must be allocated to Parent and Family Engagement activities at the school level.

4. Administration Update

- Goals:
- Data for grades 3-5 in the 2023-24 school year showed 63% proficiency on the FAST Mathematics assessment. The goal for 2024-25 is to increase this to 65% proficiency in grades 3-5.
- The goal for reading proficiency in grades 3-5 is to increase from 59% to 61%, with a focus on improving lowest quartile growth from 53% to 56%.
- ESE scholars in grades 3-5 had 38% achievement in Reading, Math, and Science in 2023-24, and the goal is to raise this to 41%.
- The school aims to reduce the percentage of students with excessive absences from 34% to 29% (217 students) and reduce the number of referrals from 37% to 32%, with an overall **10% reduction in referrals (approximately 90 fewer referrals).
- The Provision Packs initiative was introduced and reviewed.

5. SAC Membership Review

- The current SAC membership was reviewed.
- A motion was made for attendees to become official SAC members. The list of approved members was documented and taken into possession by Mr. Anderson.
