## **COURSES**

English and Second Language (ESL): Programs at all levels to help adults improve English language skills.

GED: Preparing students to obtain a high school equivalency through the GED exam.

College Pathways: Bridges academic gaps and prepares students to successfully enter college. Includes academic training, Accuplacer preparation, and college navigation support. Classes are offered online and at Hubbs Center.

Career Pathways: Training opportunities are offered in the fields of health care, IT, small business, customer service, building maintenance/OSHA 10, Commercial Driver's License, Boiler's License, and Para Educator. Classes are often offered in partnership with employers and community organizations including Saint Paul Public Schools, Goodwill, and the Metropolitan Airports Commission.

Math: Learners can receive math instruction at four different levels to prepare them for daily life, college, or career.

Citizenship: Prepare for the Naturalization Test.

Everyday Digital Literacy: Improve practical technology skills such as email, website navigation, and more.
