Dear Tipps Elementary Parents,

At Tipps Elementary, we believe in fostering strong partnerships between home and school to ensure the success of our students. As part of that, we understand that sometimes concerns may arise. When they do, we encourage you to follow these steps to make certain that issues are resolved quickly and effectively at the campus level:

- 1. First, speak with your child's teacher: The classroom teacher is often the best resource to address concerns about your child's day to day experiences. Most issues can be resolved by speaking directly with the person closest to the situation.
- 2. Next, contact the Assistant Principals: If you feel that our concern hasn't been resolved after talking with the teacher, our Assistant Principals are available to provide additional support.
- **3. Finally, reach out to the Principal:** If further assistance is needed, we encourage you to reach out to the Principal to further discuss and confirm that your concerns are addressed.

We are committed to working with you to resolve any issues as we all share the same goal: creating a positive learning environment for all our students.

In addition to resolving concerns, we ask that you support your child's learning at home. You can do this by:

- Checking in daily: Ask your child about their day and listen to their experiences.
- Reading together: Reading with your child not only supports academic development, but also creates an opportunity for meaningful bonding.
- **Supporting your child's teacher:** Speaking positively about their teacher and reinforcing the

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importance of school can make a big difference in your child's attitude toward learning.

We are also excited to announce that we are working on sending out **volunteer opportunities**! If you are interested in volunteering, we ask that you complete a **volunteer orientation** first. Field Trip Chaperone Expectations

As part of our efforts to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all students during field trips, I'd like to outline our expectations for chaperones. If you're interested in volunteering as a chaperone for any of our upcoming field trips, we kindly ask that you visit the school to have your State issued Driver's License scanned in our RAPTOR system and receive a Field Trip chaperone tag the morning of the event. This is a standard procedure to ensure the safety of all students under our care. (Note – no ID's that are scanned to a phone can be accepted.)

Chaperones will be expected to accompany their assigned group of students throughout the duration of the field trip, following the designated itinerary and ensuring that all safety guidelines are adhered to. Your presence and guidance are invaluable in enhancing the educational experience for our students outside of the classroom.

Please note that while we appreciate the enthusiasm of younger siblings, we kindly request that they do not accompany chaperones on field trips. Our focus during these outings is on the students and their learning experiences, and we want to ensure that chaperones can dedicate their full attention to the students they are supervising.
