Rossville Schools worked with Healthy Communities of Clinton County over the past few years along with many other districts in our surrounding area. Our focus was on preventing youth suicide initiative. We learned best practices in the field and have implemented many changes as a school system. Our goal was to help meet our students, K-12th, where they're at emotionally, provide supports for our students, and finally provide a common curriculum focusing on mental health. I am happy to report our district has purchased, and we are ready to implement our curriculum Second Step.

Second Step curriculum will cover the following common units:

Growth Mindset & Goal setting: Children learn how to pay attention and manage distractions, develop a growth mindset and apply goal-setting strategies to their social and academic lives.

Emotion Management: Children learn how to identify and label emotions and use emotion management strategies—including stress management for older students—to calm strong feelings.

Empathy & Kindness: Children learn how to recognize kindness and act kindly, have empathy for others and take others' perspectives, and recognize kind acts and empathy as important elements of building and maintaining relationships.

Problem-Solving: Children learn how to identify and state a problem, recognize if a problem is an accident, and use the STEP problem-solving process:

S: Say the problem

T: Think of solutions

E: Explore the outcomes

P: Pick a solution

Teachers will begin with a few lessons in December and start fresh in January with at least one lesson per week.
