Understanding Title I: Empowering Student Success





Title I is a federal program that provides funding to enhance student learning.

Purpose of Title I

- * Ensure all children have fair and equal opportunities for education.
- * Provide significant support for students to obtain high-quality education.
- * Help students reach proficiency on challenging state academic standards.
- * Ensure students perform well on state academic assessments.

Who Receives Title I Funds?

Title I funds support public schools with high percentages of low-income students, aiming to boost academic achievement for disadvantaged or at-risk students and ensure access to quality education.

WM Elementary Goals

- * Enhance student academic performance
- * Offer targeted instructional support
- * Deliver professional development for educators and staff
- * Encourage parent and family involvement


WMES is a Schoolwide Program

A schoolwide program can serve all students rather than offering separate services. It provides flexibility by treating all students as Title I-eligible and all teachers as Title I teachers. To qualify as a schoolwide program, at least 40% of the student population must be identified as low-income.

Parent Rights to Know

Parents have the right to be informed about the qualifications of their child's classroom teacher and/or paraprofessional in a school receiving Title I funds.

- * Whether the teacher has fulfilled state qualification and licensing requirements for the grade levels and subjects they teach.
- * Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency or provisional license for which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- * Whether the teacher is teaching in the subject area of their certification.
- * Whether your child is receiving services from paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

School-Parent-Student Compact

* Each Title I school, in collaboration with parents, develops a school-parentstudent compact that defines the shared responsibility of parents, staff, and students for improving academic achievement and outlines how the school and parents will work together to achieve this goal.

* The School-Parent-Compact is a written agreement that is distributed to parents each year.


