PROGRAMS OF STUDY

- At St. X, we believe exposing our young men to serving their community is of utmost importance. Our students are required to do community service freshman through junior year. Students are offered both direct and indirect opportunities, with at least half of their hours being required direct service involving intentional work with the poor and marginalized communities.
- Students are admitted based on academic achievement and promise, as indicated by the STS Placement Exam.
- Students are grouped according to ability in core subjects:
HONORS PROGRAM – for gifted students with exceptional ability and motivation.
ACADEMIC PROGRAM – for those following a traditional college preparatory sequence.
EXCEL PROGRAM – for those needing remediation in core subjects.
- Classes meet five days per week for 45 minutes.
