 Students must earn 240 credits to graduate (passing grade to earn credit is “D” or better). Credits must include four years of English; two years of math; two years of science (physical and life); three and a half years of social science; two years of physical education; one semester of health; and 30 credits in at least two of the following three areas: LOTE, career technical education, and visual/performing arts.
