#### **DISCUSSION**

- 5. Superintendent's Report
  - 5.1. Communications/Recognitions
    - 5.1.1 We are excited to welcome 52 exceptional individuals to the Kingsburg Elementary family! Our Principals and Directors introduced these new staff members, and we couldn't be more thrilled to have them join our school community. A heartfelt thank you to each of these individuals for choosing Kingsburg!

- 5.1.2 The Kingsburg Family Math Festival will be held on October 17th from 5:00-6:00 PM at Lincoln School. We invite you to join us for an evening of fun and learning.
- 5.1.3 The Kingsburg Community Task Force meets monthly at various locations, bringing together members from churches, businesses, our two school districts, and city services to discuss community needs and upcoming events. Mrs. Simmons, Mrs. Pasillas, or Dr. Sever will attend these meetings based on their availability.
- 5.1.4 Stay tuned for more details about our upcoming Community Schools commercial, highlighting the great work being done across our district.
- 6. Assistant Superintendent- Curriculum & Instruction, Special Projects' Report
  - 6.1. The Consolidated Application (ConApp) has been submitted. The ConApp is used by the California Department of Education (CDE) to allocate categorical funds from various federal programs to county offices, school districts, and direct-funded charter schools throughout California. Each year, typically between mid-May and the end of June, local educational agencies (LEAs) submit the spring release of the ConApp through the Consolidated Application and Reporting System (CARS). This submission documents participation in the programs and provides assurances that the LEA will comply with the legal requirements of each. Program entitlements are determined by the formulas established in the program laws.
  - 6.2. The annual Williams visits are scheduled for September 24-26. A representative from the Fresno County Superintendent of Schools (FCSS) will ensure we meet textbook requirements, comply with posting regulations, and maintain our facilities in proper condition.
  - 6.3. The next possible curriculum adoption will be for math, with a piloting phase set to begin in November 2025. Adoption may follow after the pilot year.
- 7. Assistant Superintendent- Business Services' Report
  - 7.1. Projects Update
    - 7.1.1 A mini-split system has been installed in Room 19 at Washington School, providing heating and cooling for small groups and counseling sessions.
    - 7.1.2 Food Services is incorporating more fresh fruits into daily meals, much to the students' enjoyment. This change also helps reduce waste and cleanup time. Kristy and her team are finding creative ways to encourage more students to participate in the breakfast and lunch programs.
    - 7.1.3 A temporary fence has been installed around the Reagan portable area, with the buildings scheduled to be delivered during the second week of October. The new buildings will have their own bell and fire alarm systems integrated with the existing system. The project is expected to be completed by the end of January.
    - 7.1.4 The new golf carts from the Air Pollution Control District will arrive on Thursday. We will prepare for another auction round to surplus the old carts.
    - 7.1.5 The independent financial audit is scheduled for October 3. We will be working to provide any necessary documents leading up to the audit.
