

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

Average CIS IBDP score vs. Worldwide Average






This has been an impactful year, with CIS engaging the school and local community in meaningful sustainability initiatives.



Another fantastic year at CIS! The student-athletes have exemplified a high-performance culture, showcasing tremendous effort and dedication.




