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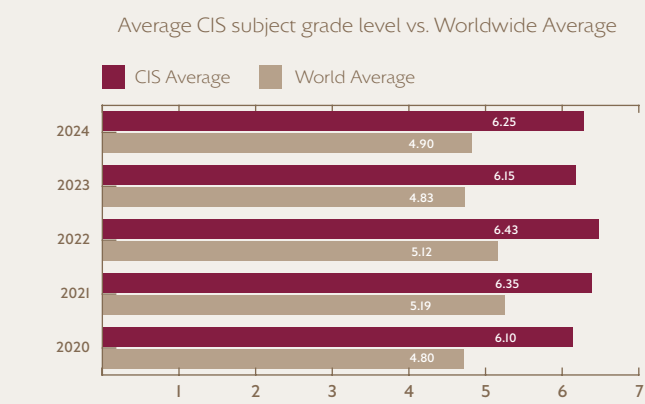
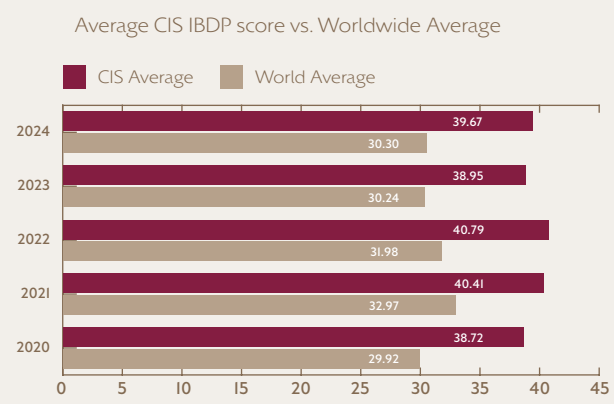

From sourcing materials to minimising waste, our commitment to sustainability has guided us in creating an event that not only meets but exceeds our goals.

Together, we have achieved remarkable milestones, demonstrating that a greener future is not just a dream, but a reality we can build together.

- 6 Recycling bins set up at 6 bin stations spread throughout the venue

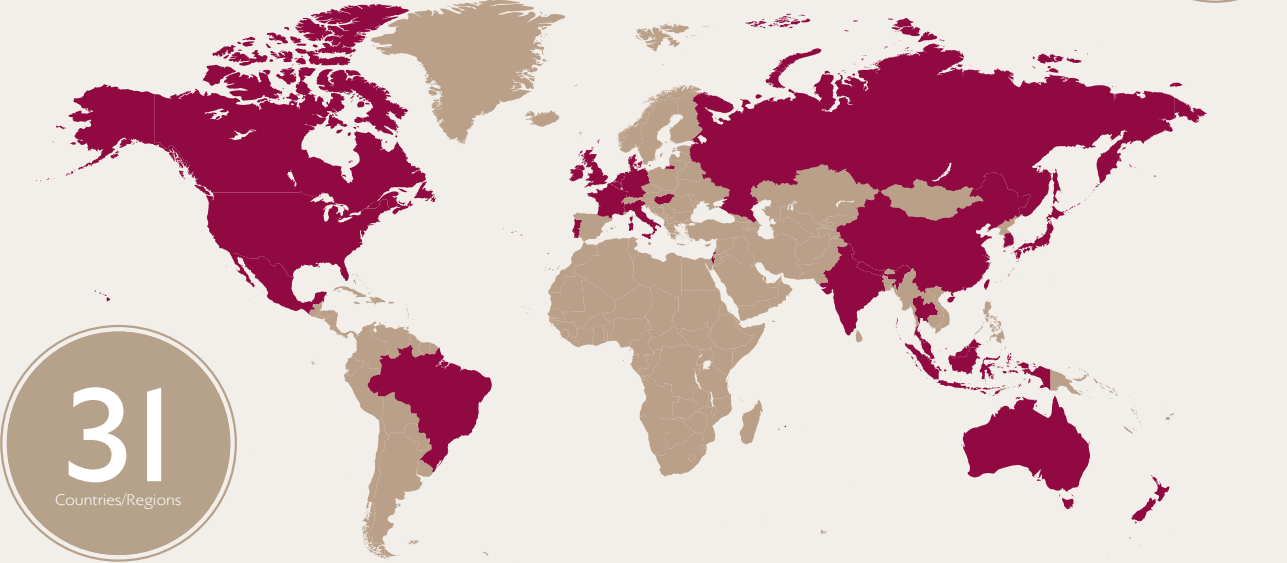
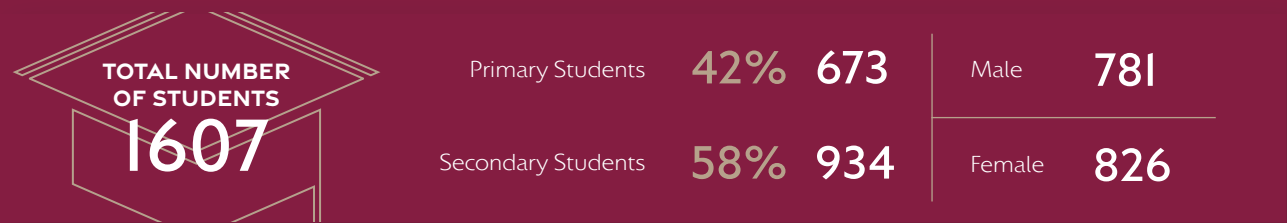

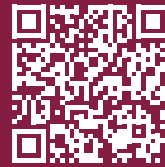
