Message From the Principal



While spring is in the air, the past couple of weeks have felt like winter is still trying to hold on for just a bit longer. Before you know it, the end of the year will be upon us, and we'll be hosting some of our traditional end of the year events. Unfortunately, we won't be able to hold all events in person, so we're working to get creative with some solutions. I'll outline a few of these changes for you.

8th grade continuation will be held at Challenge outdoors this year on Wednesday, May 26, at 4:00 p.m. Due to attendance restrictions and social distancing guidelines, we can only allow 2 guests per 8th grade student just the same as for our high school graduations in CCSD. We hope this changes prior to the event, however we're required to follow the Tri-County Health Department guidelines for events. This includes 6 feet for distancing between each party.

Spring Fest will not be held in it's traditional format. We are still not allowed to include families new to Challenge until we return in August, so we will hold a special event for new families at that time. We will be hosting smaller celebrations by team the week of May 17 - 20. Thursday, May 20 will be a special day of classroom explorations by team. Friday, May 21 is a non-contact day for students. These events will be smaller in scale, but still allow some outdoor fun and festivities for our students.

Looking ahead into next year, there will be some slight changes to the calendar for your planning. We will be moving some of our conferences and non-contact days to become more aligned to the district calendar to better accommodate families and their childcare needs. We will still hold a spring Immersion week in May, however we will not hold a fall Immersion next year. After so much time spent out of school, we need to place the priority on in-person learning - especially at the start of the year.


