Message From the Principal



March has been a complete roller coaster for us in schools with the excitement of spring break, available vaccinations, and the anticipation of fully in-person learning. We've also felt the heartbreak of recent tragedies of gun violence and struggle with our own emotions and trying to find a reason for the senseless violence. Our hearts go out to those affected by these tremendous losses.

We appreciate your patience as we continue to share information regarding CMAS testing. Remember that Monday, March 29 is fully remote for middle school students! Middle School Students will test March 30 - April 2 in their assigned areas. We ask for your assistance with a few important items during testing week.

- 1. Students may not use their cell phones, personal laptops, smart watches, calculators, and any other electronic devices on testing days. It's best to keep them at home.
- 2. If you have opted your student out of testing, all absences will be excused. Just call the attendance line to excuse the absences.
- 3. There will be no classroom activities for students who have opted out of testing.

As has always been the case for parents in Colorado, you can excuse your student from CMAS testing. If this is your choice, please fill out the exemption form located on the State Assessment Exemption tile at

my.cherrycreekschools.org. You can view instructions for filling out the exemption here.
