Message From the Principal



We definitely have some exciting news to share with you this week. I ask that you read the weekly update from CCSD Superintendent, Dr. Scott Siegfried that was sent out earlier today. In his letter he begins to discuss our district plan to return to full in-person learning for middle and high school students in April. This letter has answers to many of the questions we've been asking. Please stay tuned for more details in weeks to come.

State assessments continue to be a big part of internal planning conversations. We are scheduling middle school to complete CMAS tests during the last week of March while still in our hybrid model. Elementary students will test during the month of April. If you want to proactively excuse your student from state testing this year, please fill out the opt-out form located on the State Assessment Exemption tile at my.cherrycreek.org. You can view instructions for filling out the exemption here. All absences will be excused if you choose to keep your child at home during testing.

This week our annual WOLF DRIVE went live on March 1. This is one of our main fundraisers for the PTCO throughout the year. Your generous support is greatly appreciated! Our PTCO is also hosting the SLEEP CHALLENGE running now until spring break. Both events are featured later on in the newsletter.


