### Message From the Principal



Yesterday we awoke to substantial snowfall that resulted in yet another snow day. It's always fun to hear students talk about how they spent their surprise vacation day at home!

We've experienced great success in getting staff members vaccinated so far. By the end of last week 100% of all CCSD employees had been invited to participate in the vaccination program, and all employees who wished to participate were able to schedule appointments by the beginning of this week. This means that most of us will receive our second round by the return from spring break, resulting in an even safer school environment for students and staff alike. Our hope is that this will position us well for a possible return to full time learning in-person prior to the end of the year. Let's all keep our fingers crossed!

State assessments continue to be a big part of internal planning conversations. We are scheduling middle school to complete CMAS tests during the last week of March while still in our hybrid model. Elementary students will test during the month of April. Just like so many things this year, we may need to adjust closer to the testing dates. Many families continue to ask about the process to opt out of CMAS this year.
