Message From the Principal



Another busy week is in the books, and believe it or not, we're quickly approaching spring break. We've been busy juggling schedules to provide coverage for staff members to get their vaccinations. So far over half of our Challenge staff has received the first vaccination with more to come this week. Each milestone we reach helps to create an environment that feels more and more familiar. Our expectation is that all staff who wish to be vaccinated will have received the second shot by the time we return from break. Once that benchmark is achieved, we can begin to have real conversations about a full return to school. Our health services team spend the month of January and early February conducting random saliva testing for elementary students. Today marks the last day of these efforts as our attention has now shifted to an all out effort to support vaccinations for all staff. Thanks for your continued flexibility and support of our efforts!

We are still awaiting a final decision from CDE regarding spring CMAS testing for students across the state. As of right now, we are still required to plan for full testing while students are in person during late March and early April. We expect there will be a high number of student exemptions this year, which will mean the data that comes from state assessments will not truly reflect student achievement in schools during this unprecedented time. The Cherry Creek School District has internal assessments that we use at the classroom and school level to determine where students are in their learning and to empower teachers with real-time data to adjust instruction and to meet the individual needs of students.

As always, if you want to proactively excuse your student from state testing this year, you must fill out the opt-out form located on the State Assessment Exemption tile at my.cherrycreek.org. You can view instructions for filling out the exemption here.
