District

Cherry Creek School District is located in the southwest metropolitan area of greater Denver and covers approximately 110 square miles. There are 43 elementary schools, 13 middle schools and 8 high schools in the district including Cherry Creek Elevation, with a population of nearly 55,000+ students. Across the district, Cherry Creek students' highest attended colleges/universities include: University of Colorado at Boulder, Metropolitan State University of Denver, Community College of Aurora, and Colorado State University. A high percentage of Cherry Creek students across the district also attend out of state and private institutions.

School

Cherry Creek Elevation opened in August 2019 as the first blended inperson/online public high school in the Cherry Creek School District. CCE is physically located in the suburban area of Centennial, Colorado and is accredited by the Colorado State Department of Education. We are committed to ensuring students have a personalized curriculum to meet their needs. The staff, faculty, counselors, and administrators promote an inclusive college and career oriented atmosphere.

Staff

30 staff members, including administration, certified teachers, two licensed school counselors, and two mental health staff.
